In our analysis of your previous and most recent testing experiences, we noticed irregularities that are inconsistent with the GMAT® terms and conditions as described in:

"You must wait at least five years if you have previously achieved a perfect Total score of 800."

Therefore, you are not permitted to take the GMAT exam again for five (5) years from the date of your last registration, July 3, 2012.
