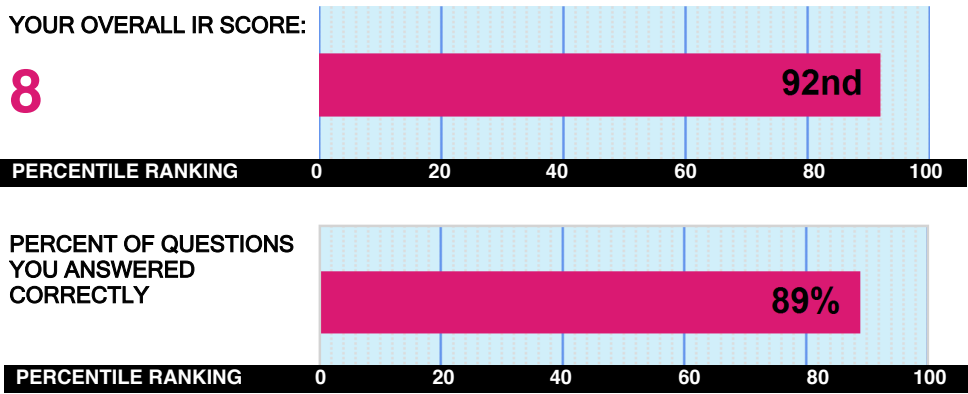

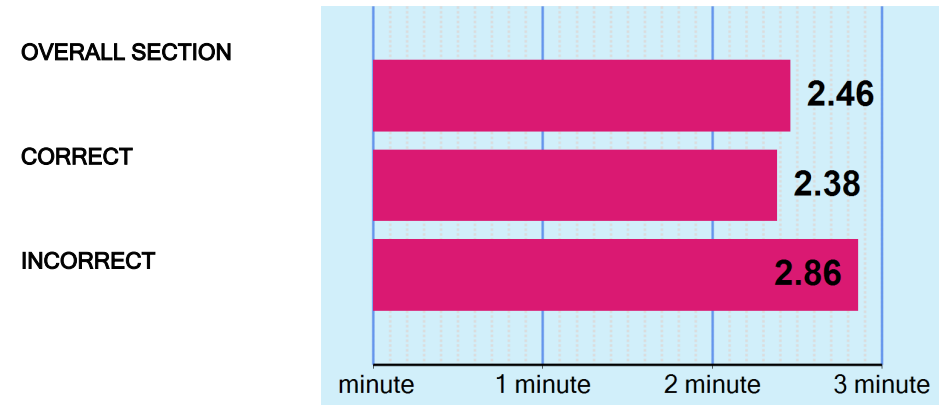
Integrated Reasoning (IR) Performance

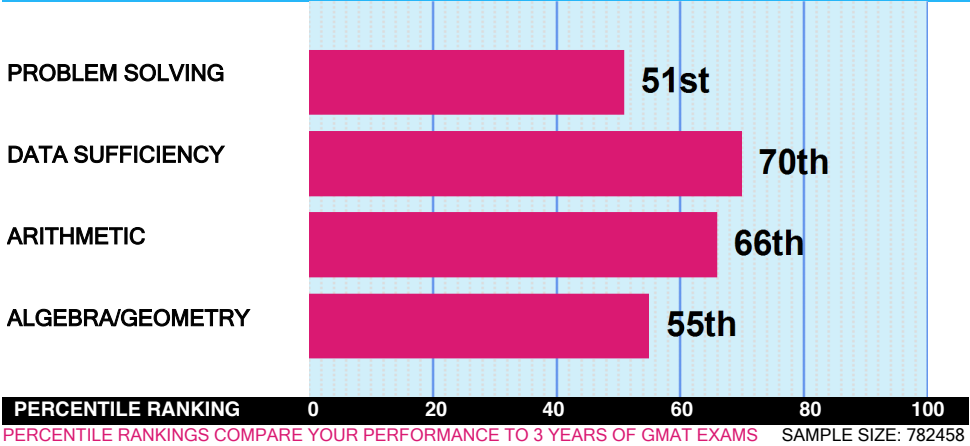

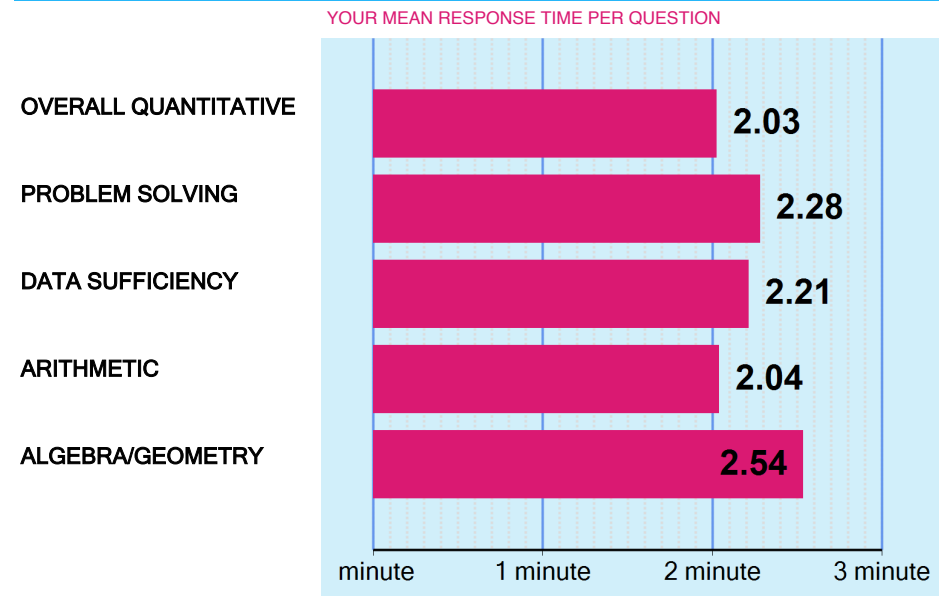
