5. Follow your four-step process for answering questions.
 - (1) Identify the Question
 - (2) Find the Support
 - (3) Predict an Answer
 - (4) Eliminate and Find a Match
6. To keep it simple, use these guidelines when studying from OG books:

Shorter passage, 3 questions	⌚ about 6 minutes
Shorter passage, 4 questions <i>or</i> Longer passage, 3 questions	⌚ about 7 minutes
Longer passage, 4 questions	⌚ about 8 minutes
