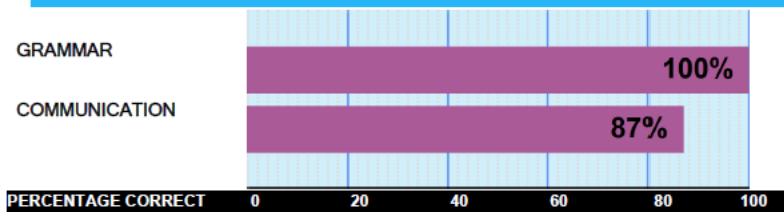

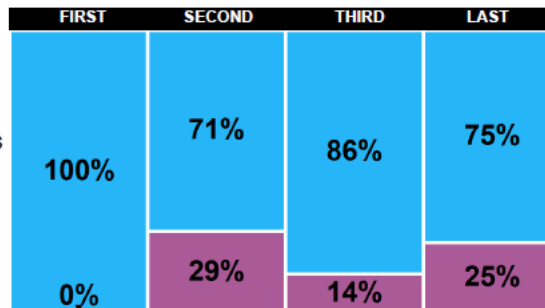

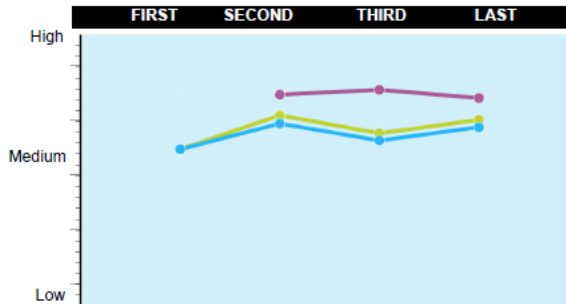

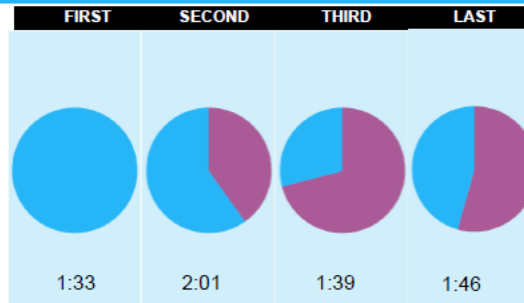

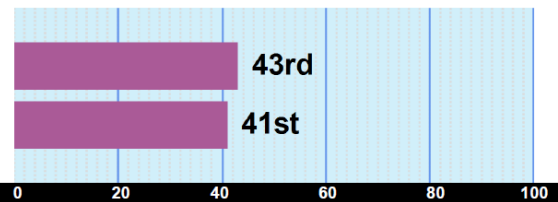

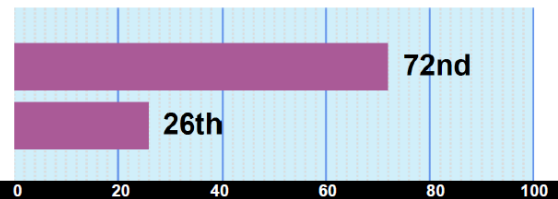

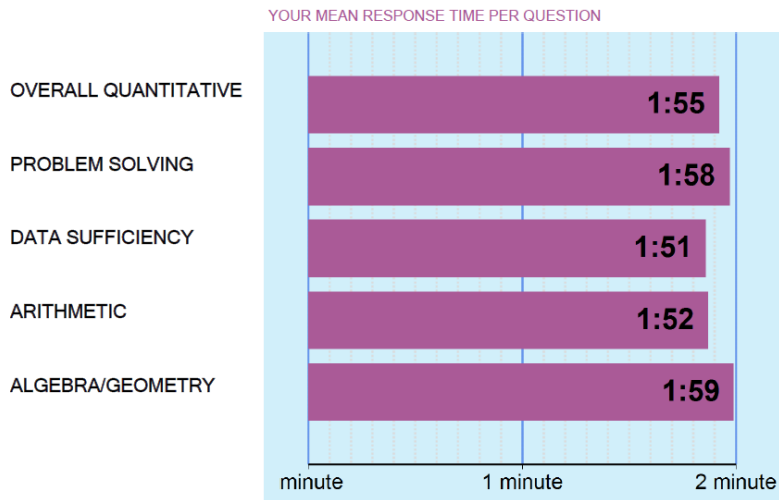

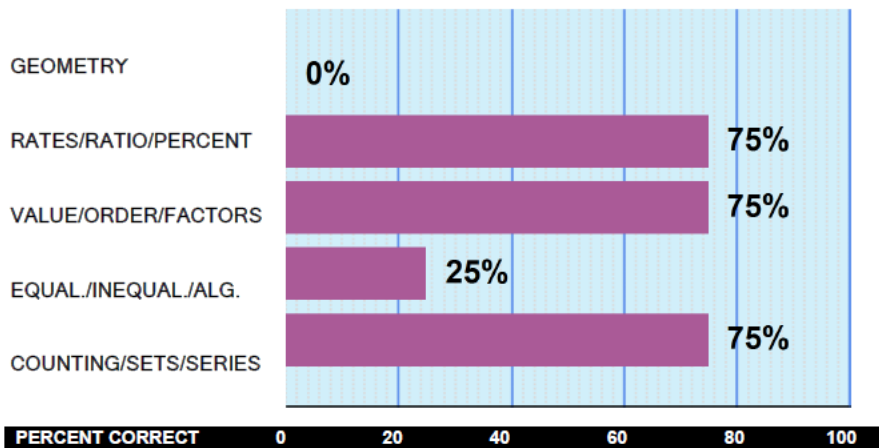

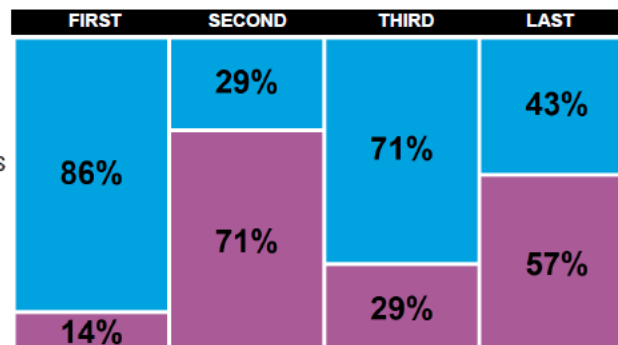

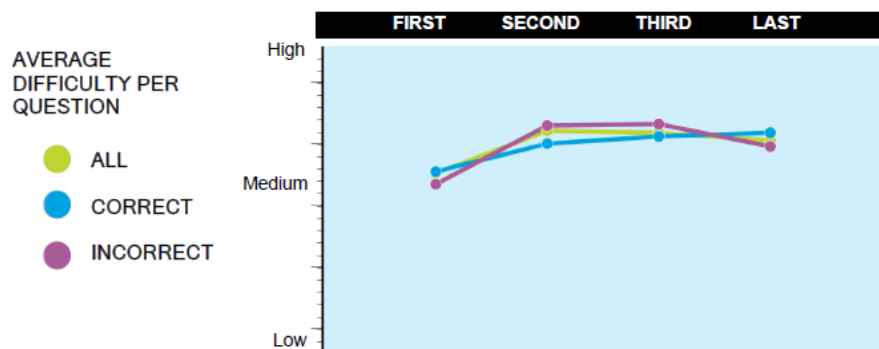
PERCENT OF QUESTIONS ANSWERED CORRECT/INCORRECT

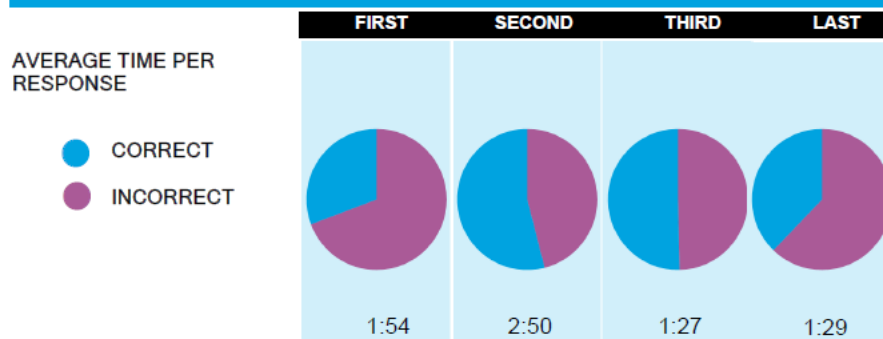
AVERAGE DIFFICULTY
