- ### SUMMARY

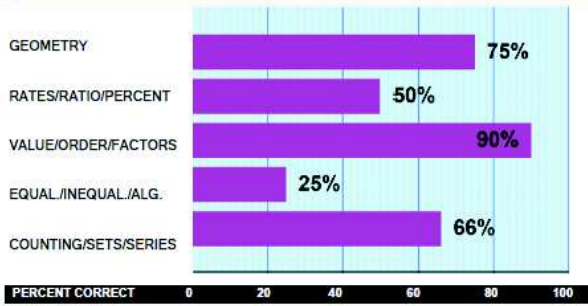

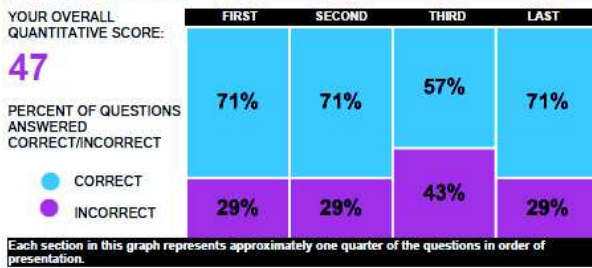

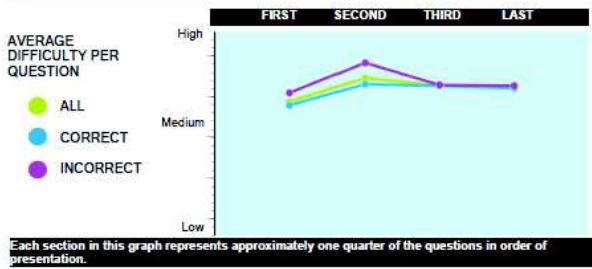
PERFORMANCE BY FUNDAMENTAL SKILLS

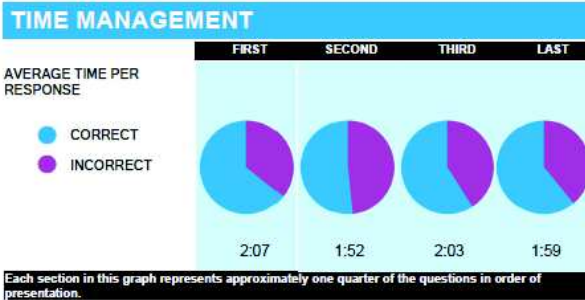


PERCENT CORRECT
