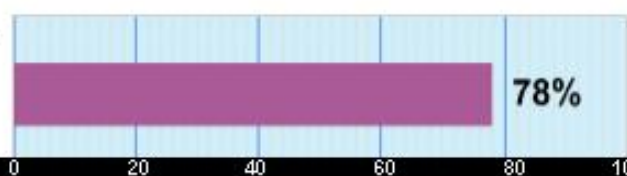

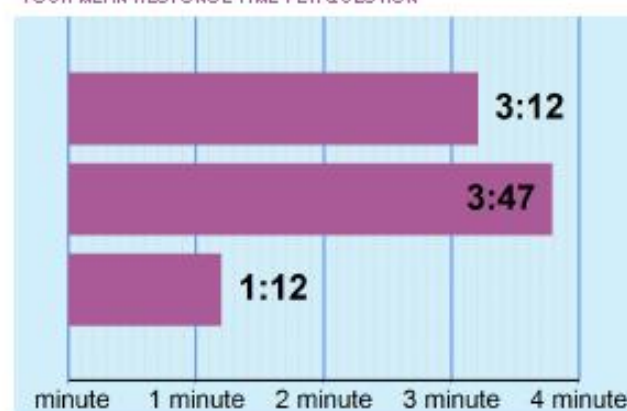

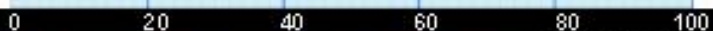

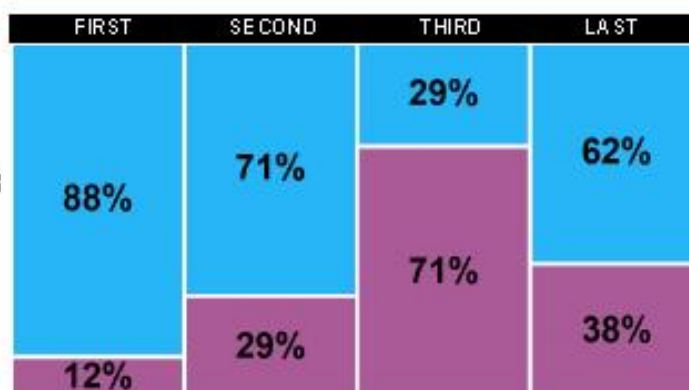

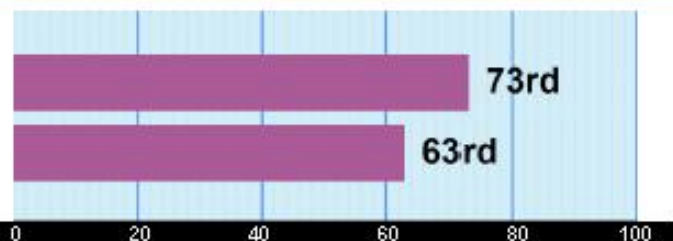

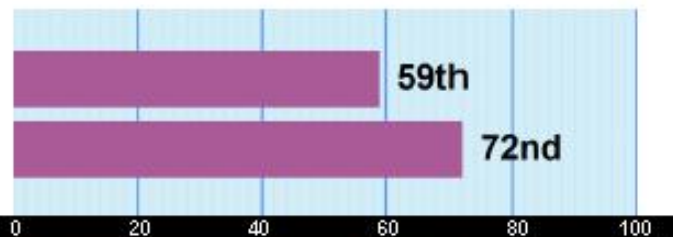

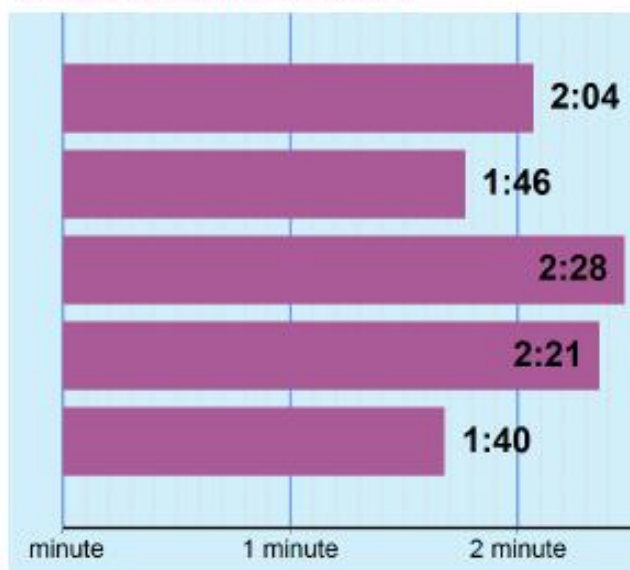

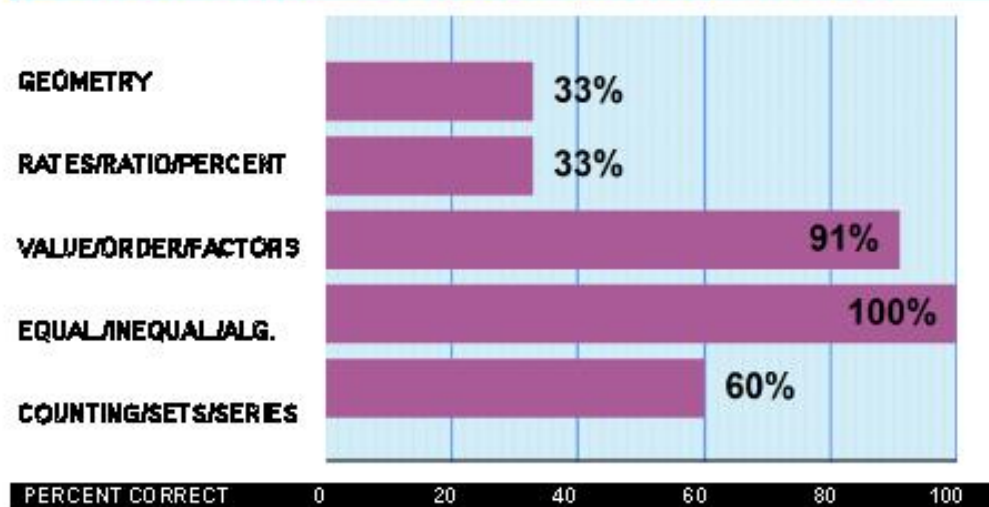

PERFORMANCE BY FUNDAMENTAL SKILLS



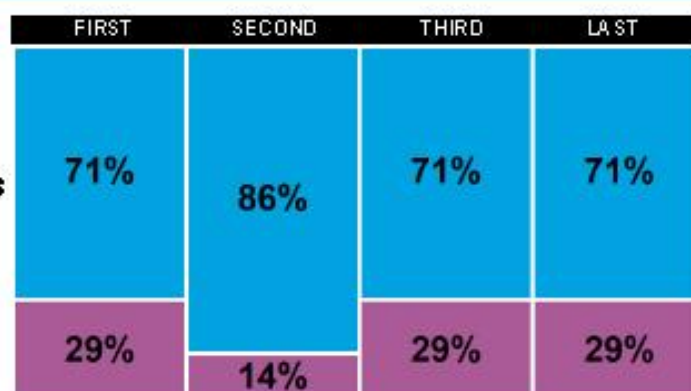
