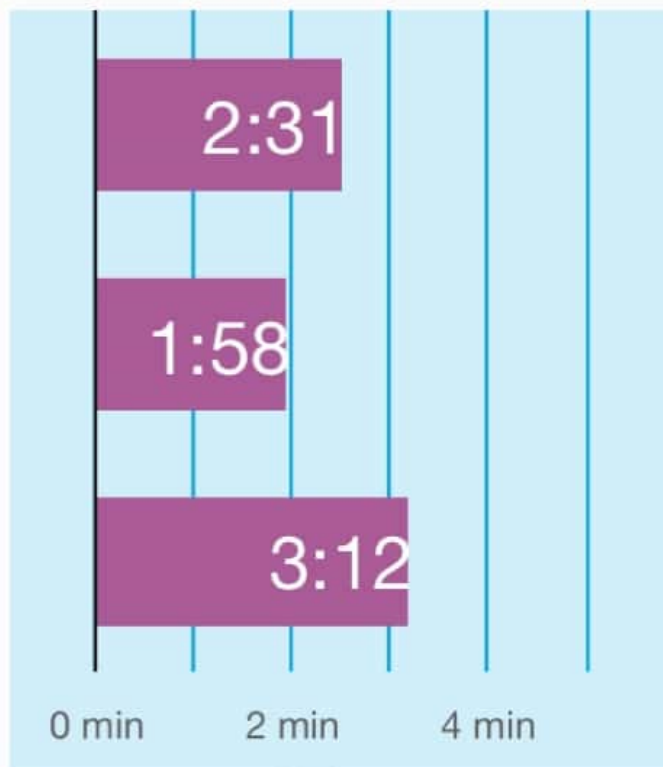

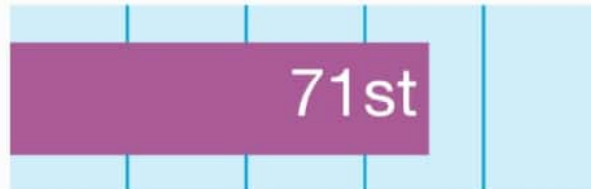

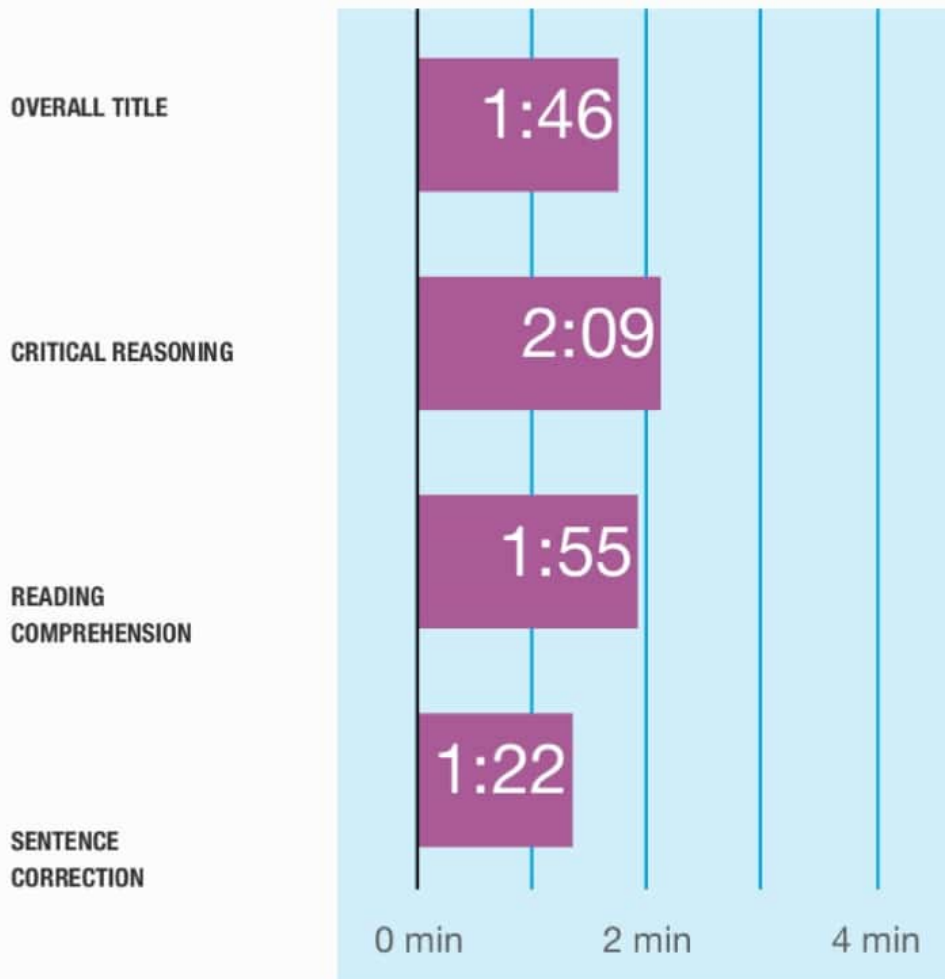

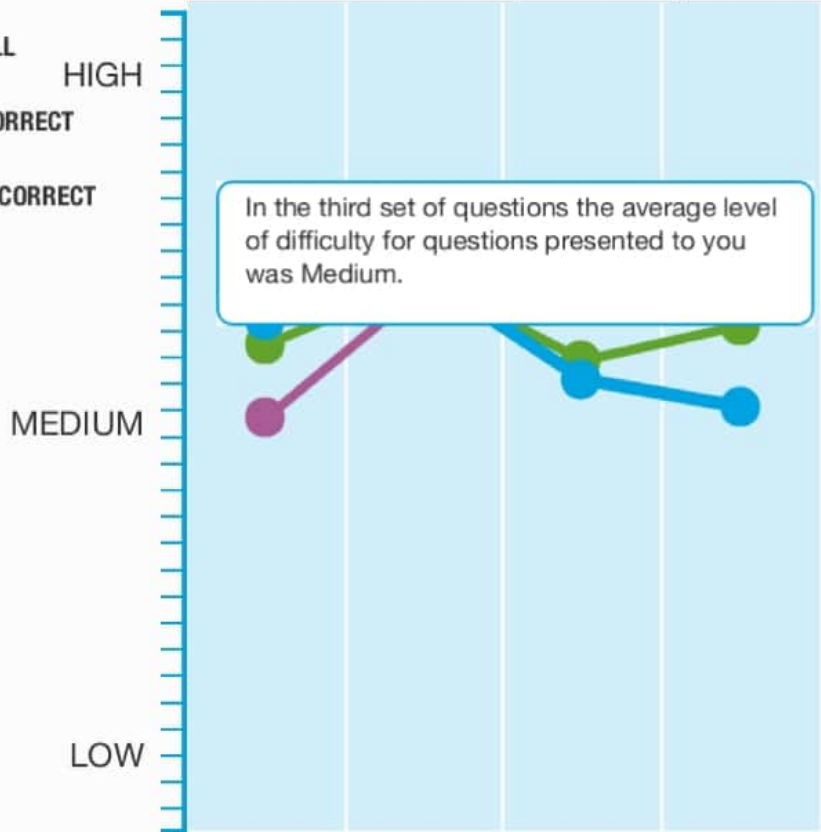

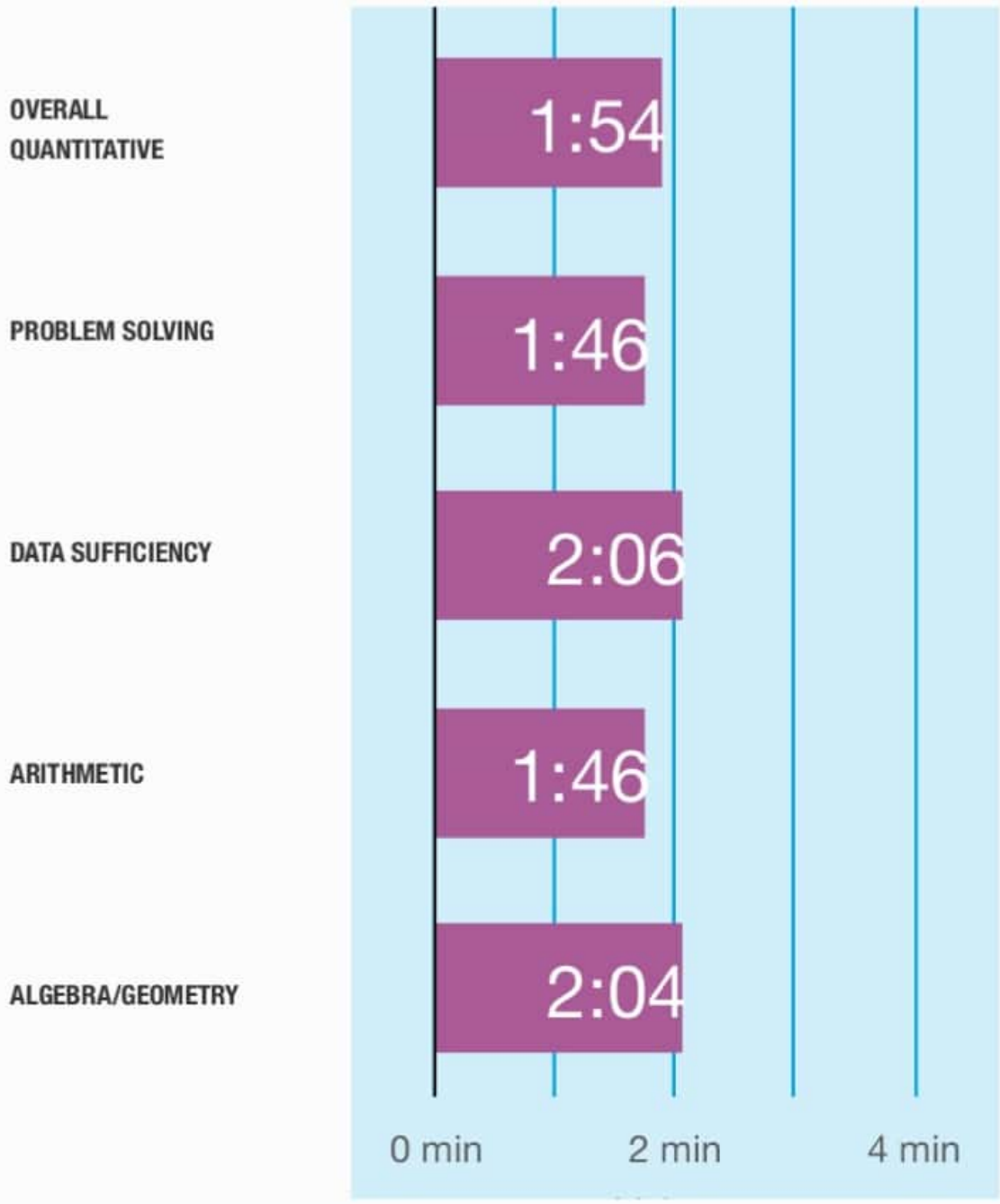

PERFORMANCE BY FUNDAMENTAL SKILLS



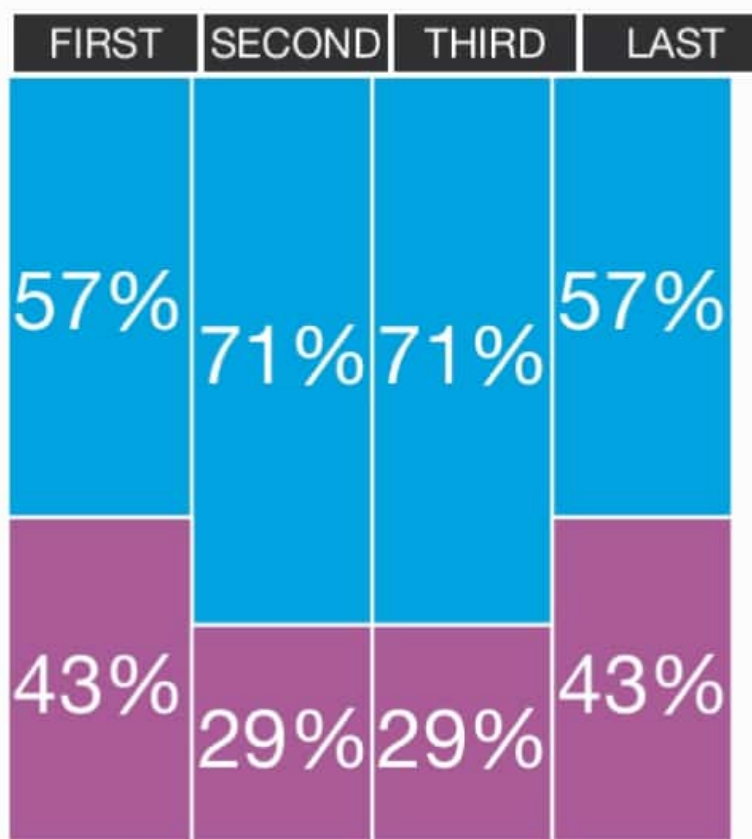

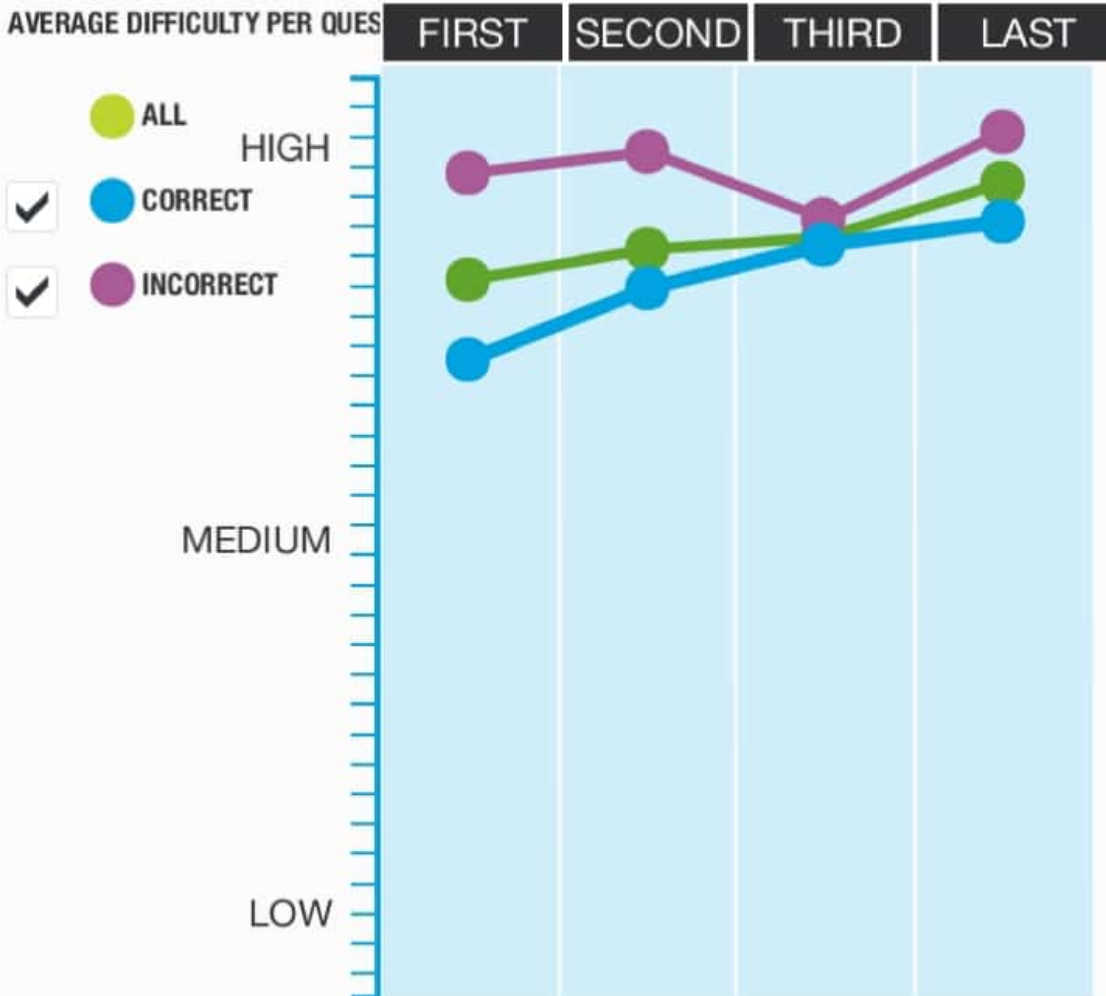
