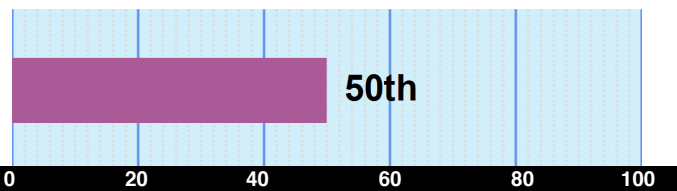

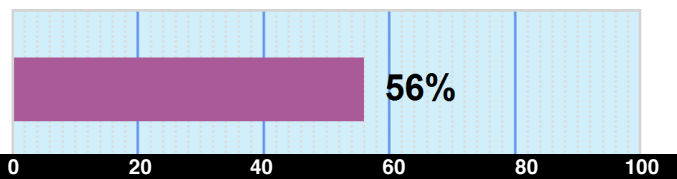

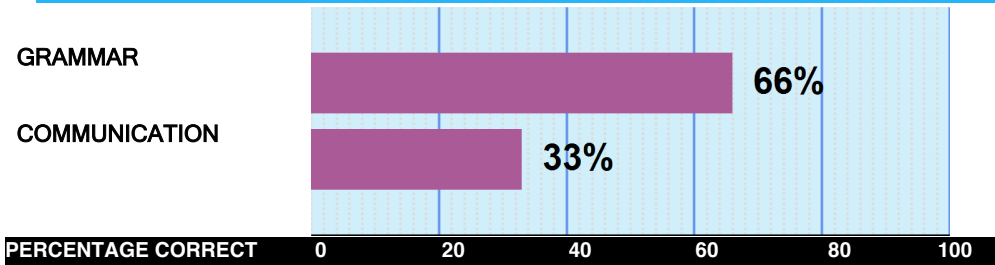

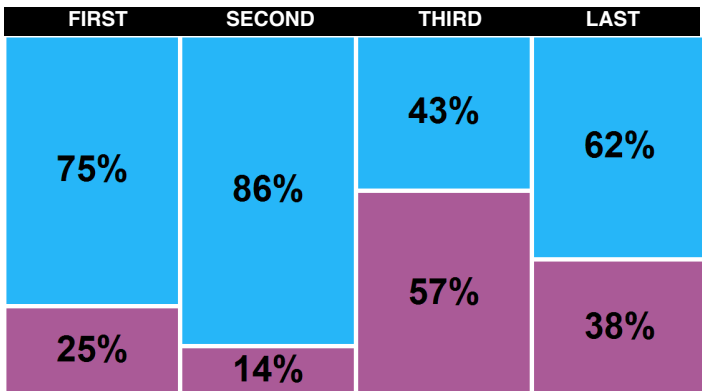

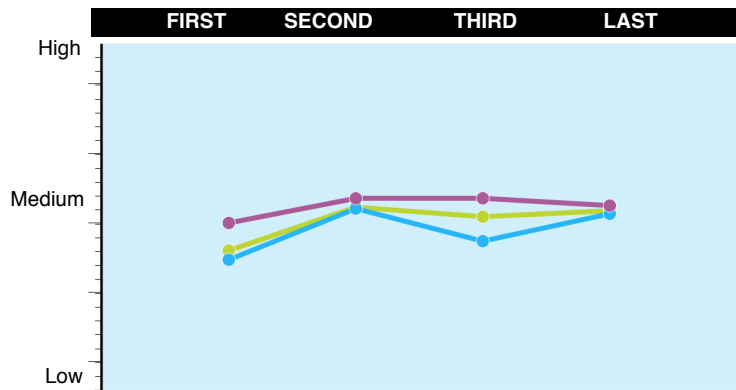

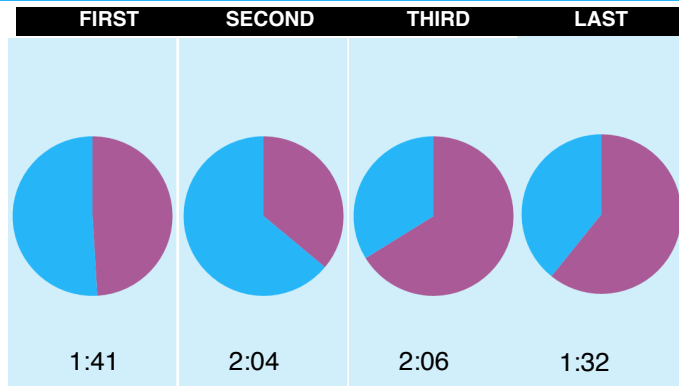

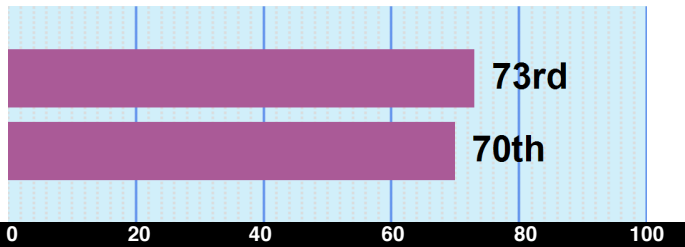

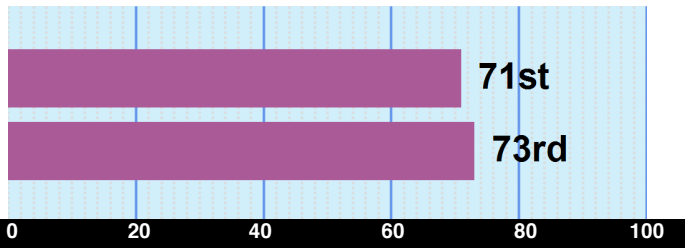

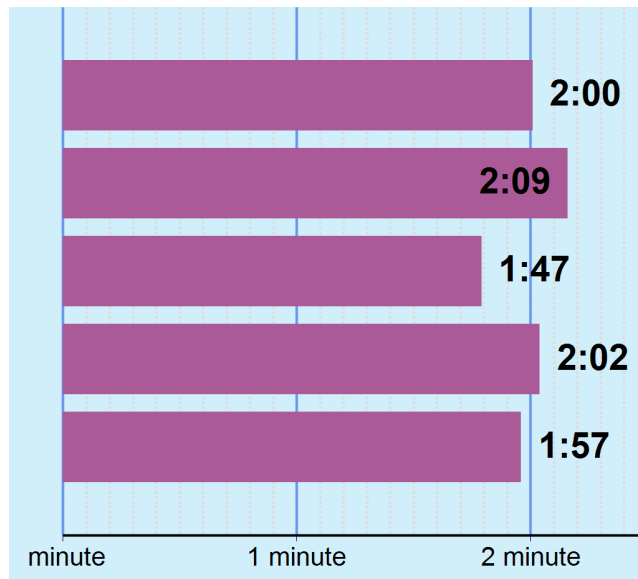

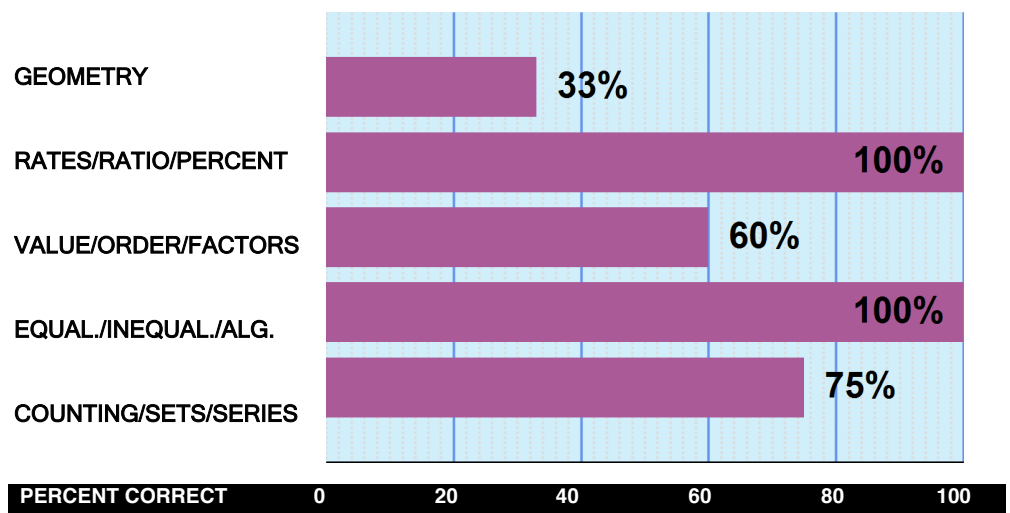

PERFORMANCE BY FUNDAMENTAL SKILLS



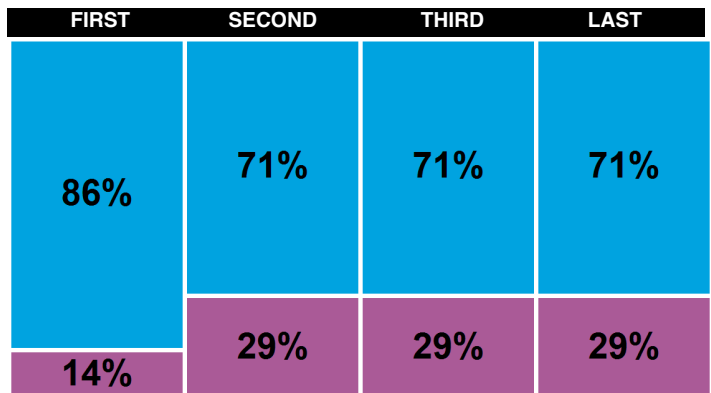

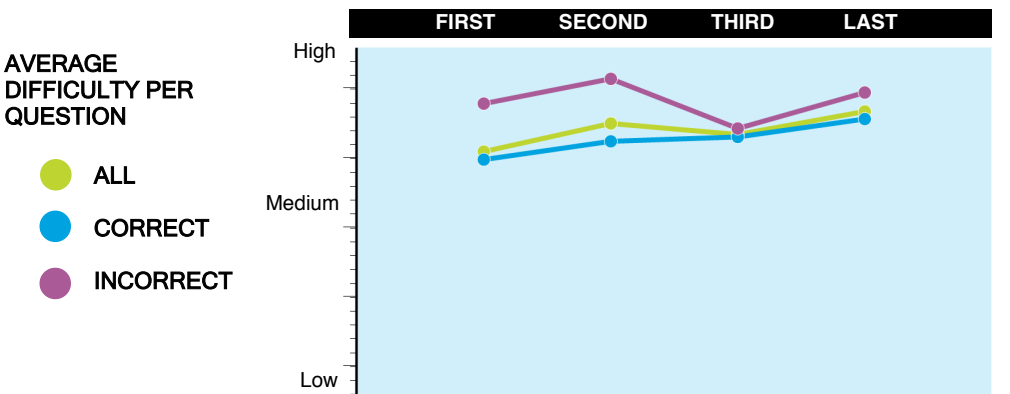
PERCENT OF QUESTIONS ANSWERED CORRECT/INCORRECT

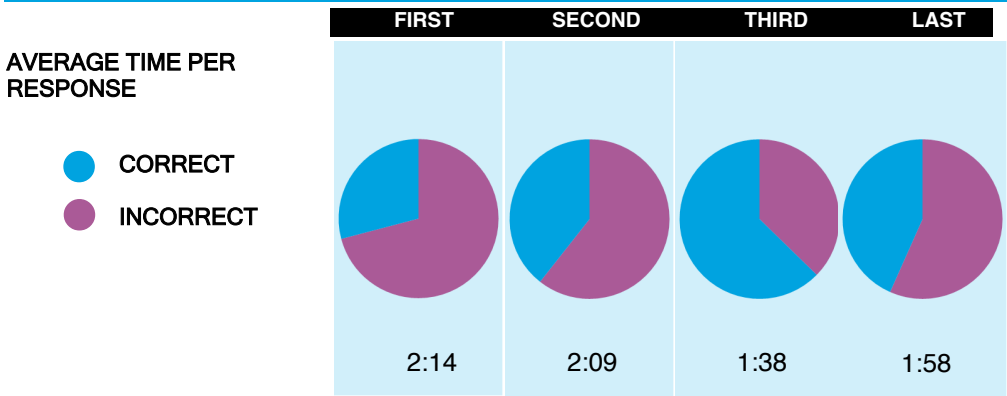

Each section in this graph represents approximately one quarter of the questions in order of presentation.

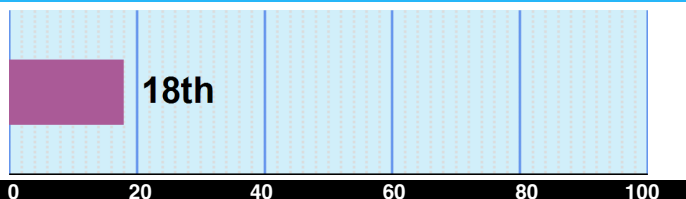

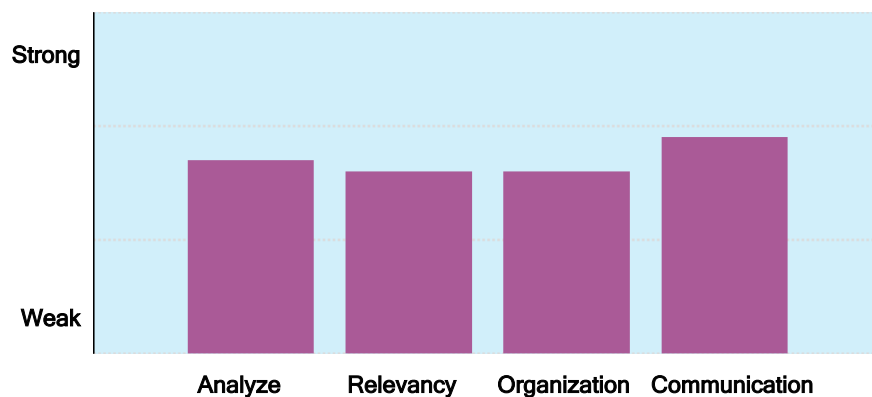
