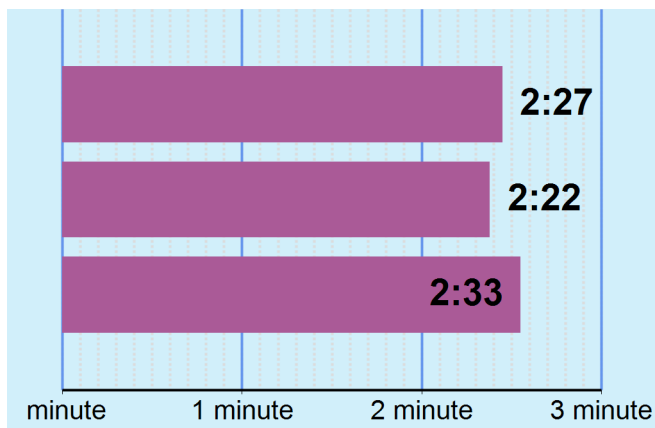

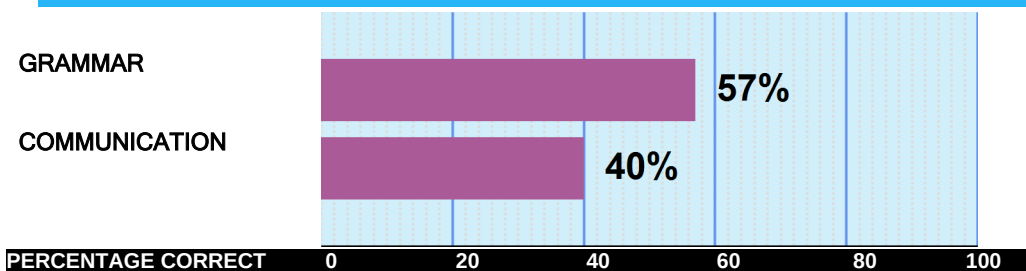

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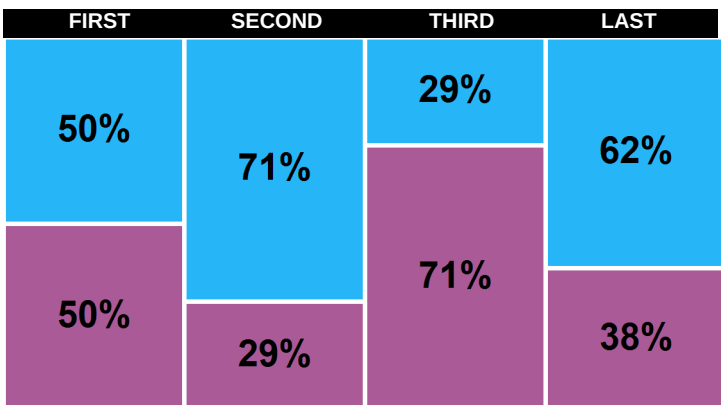

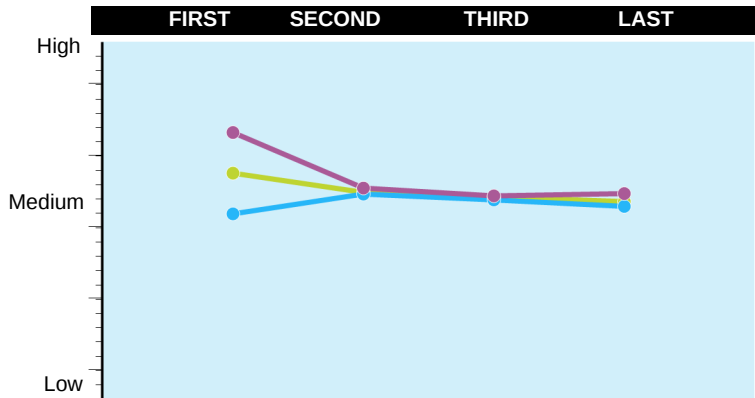

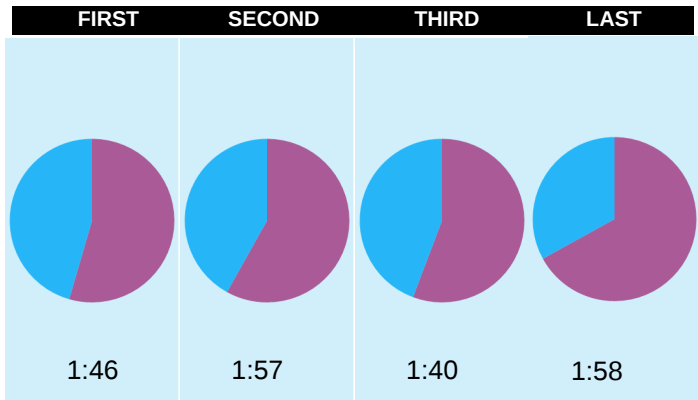

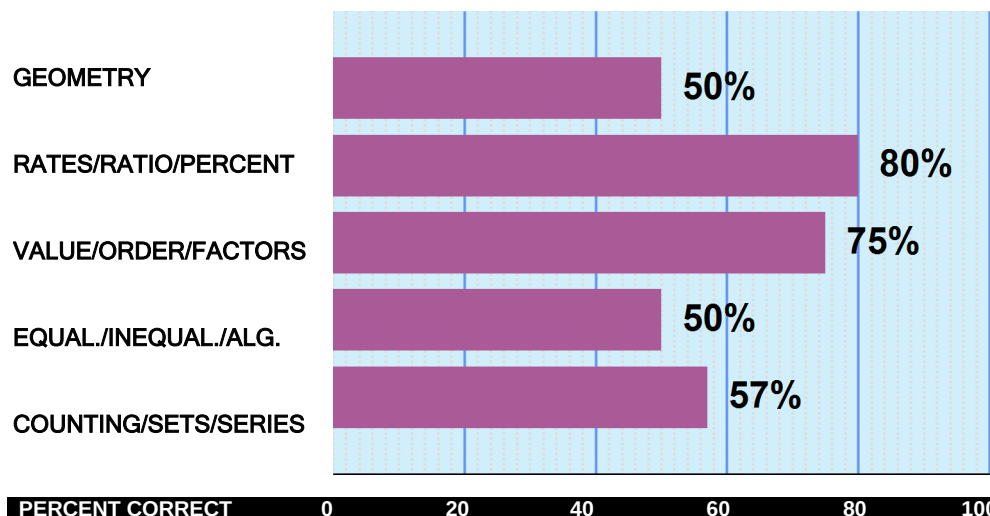

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PERFORMANCE BY FUNDAMENTAL SKILLS



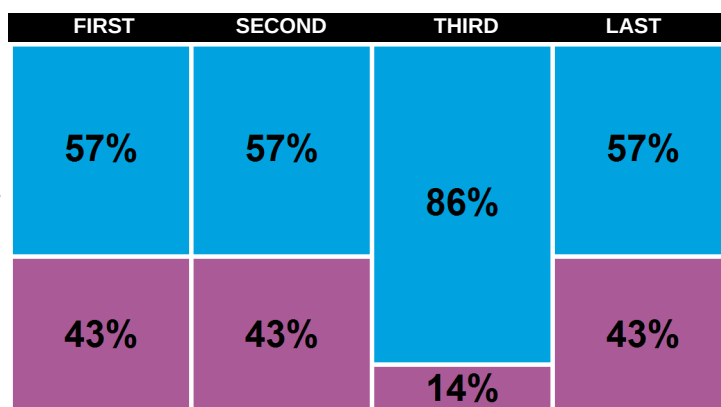

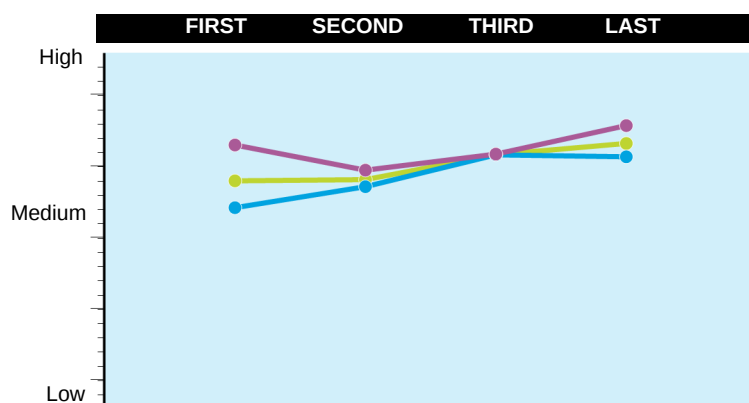

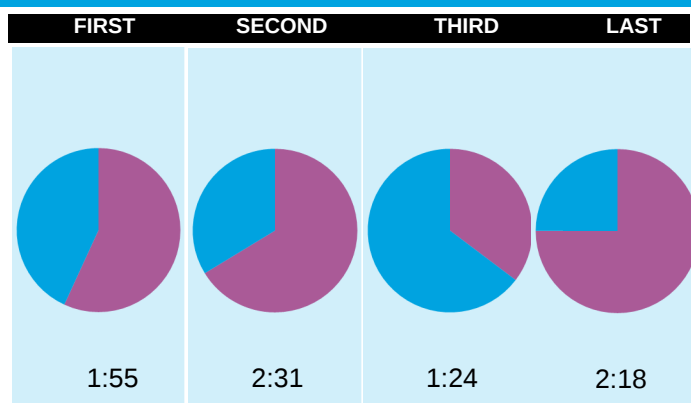
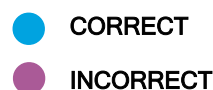
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TIME MANAGEMENT

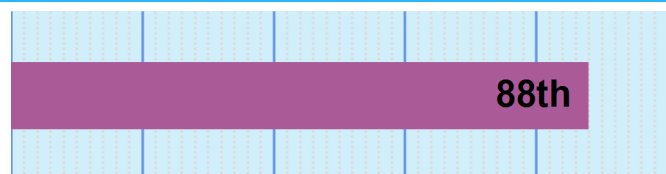

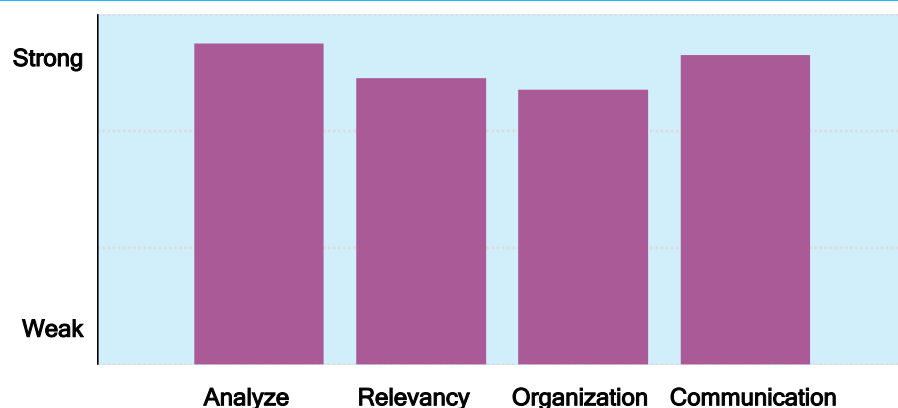
