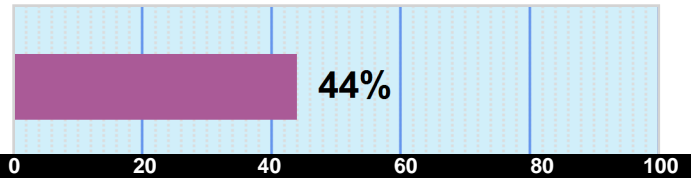

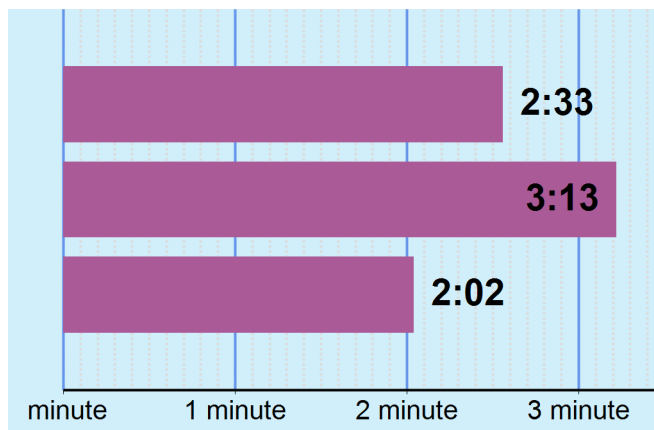

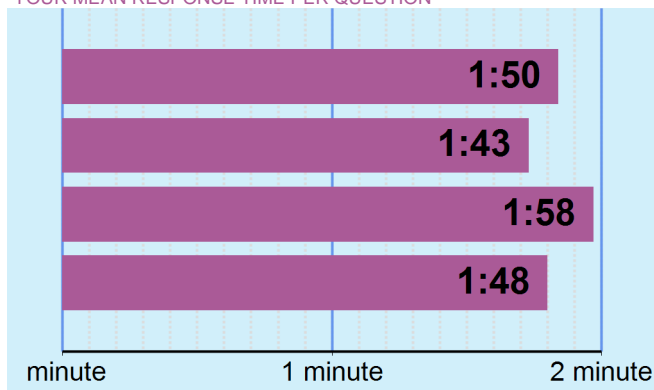

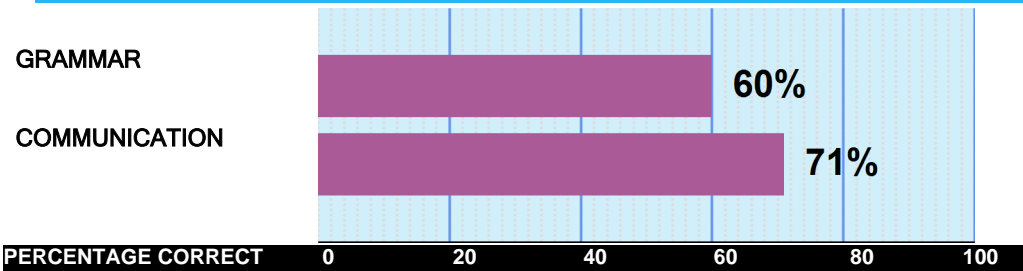

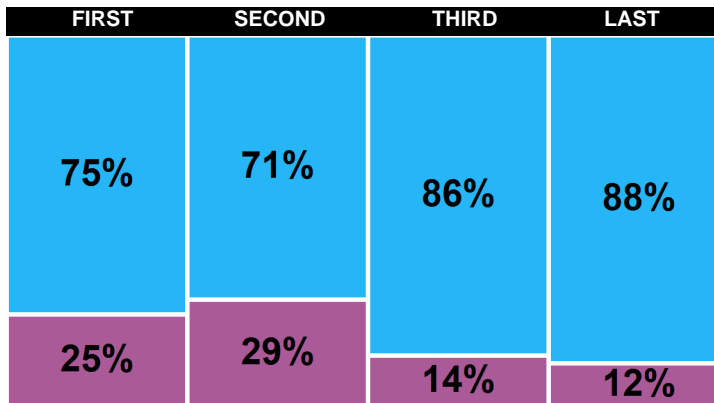

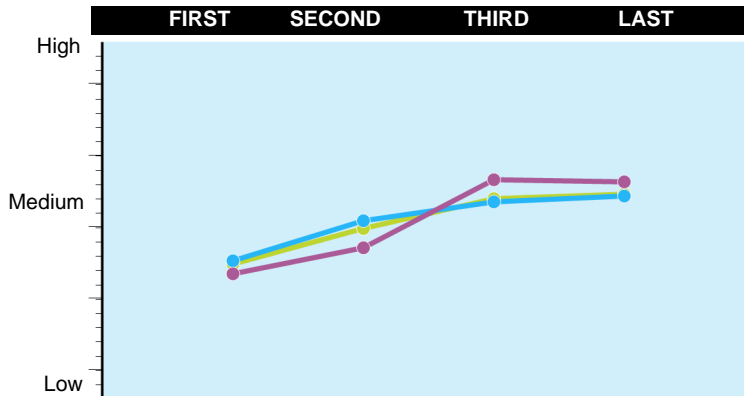

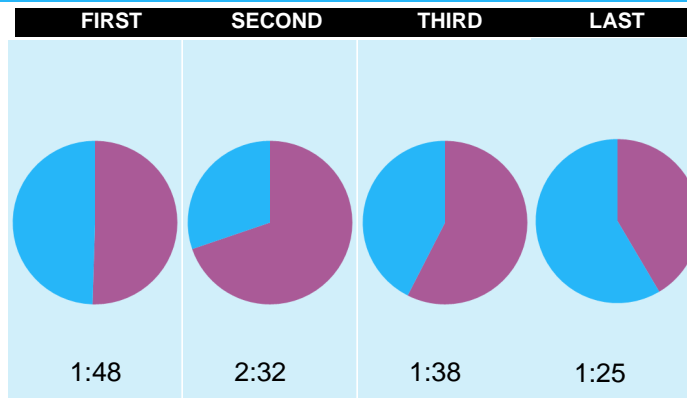

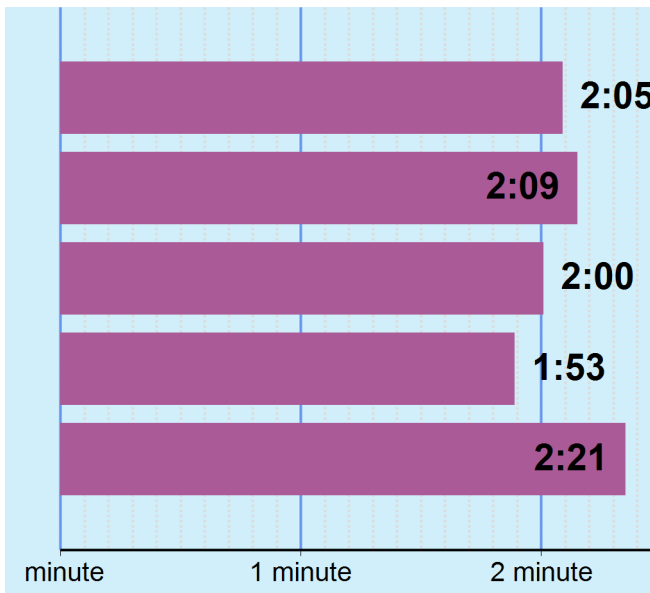

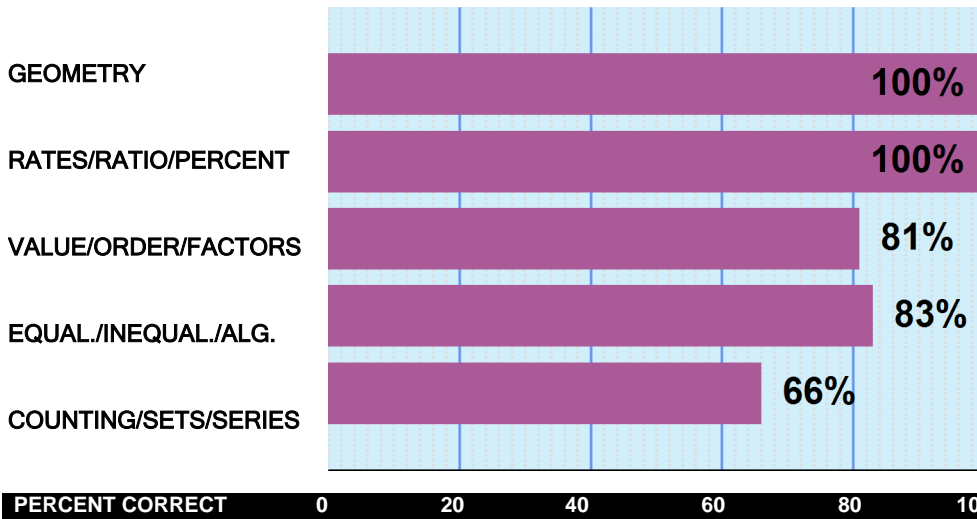

PERFORMANCE BY FUNDAMENTAL SKILLS



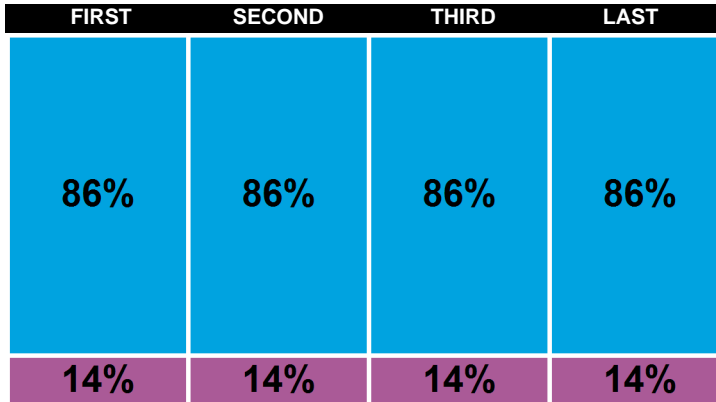

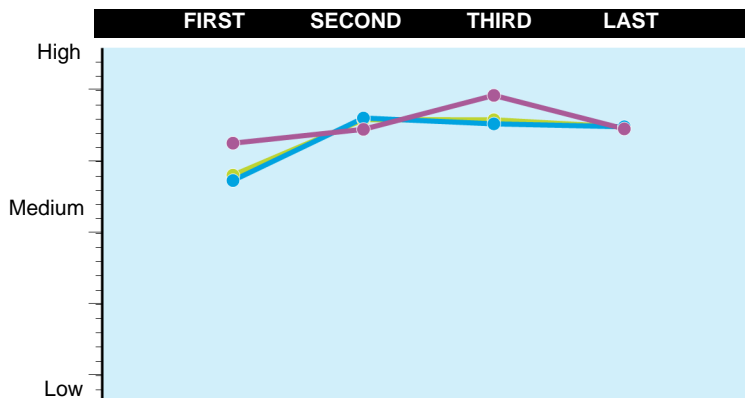

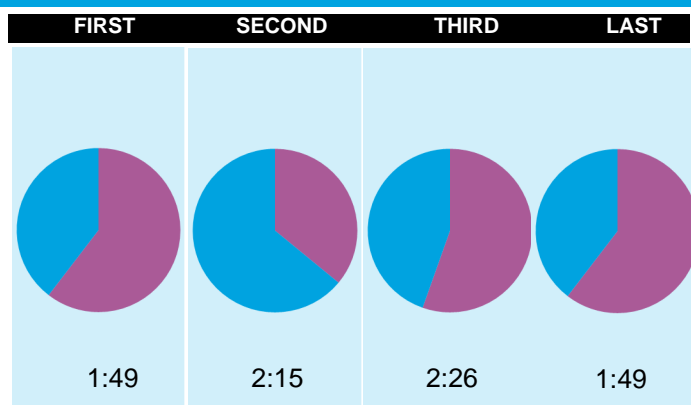
