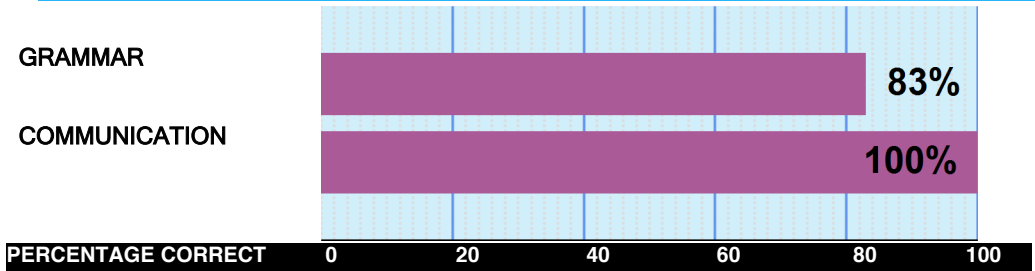

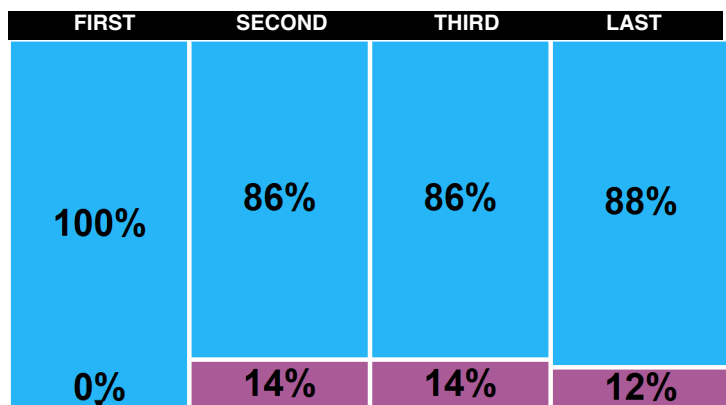

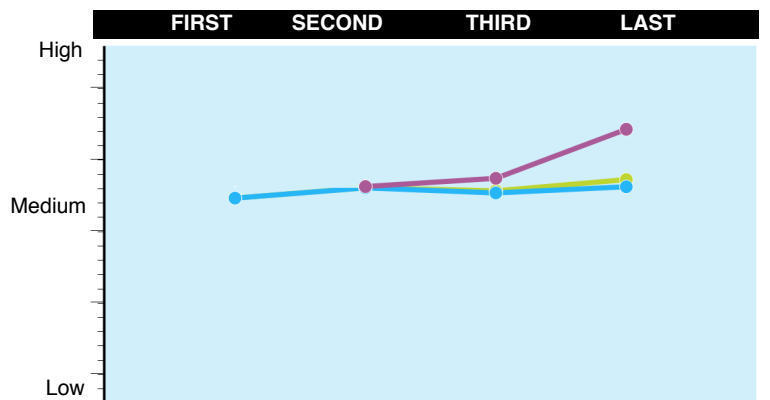

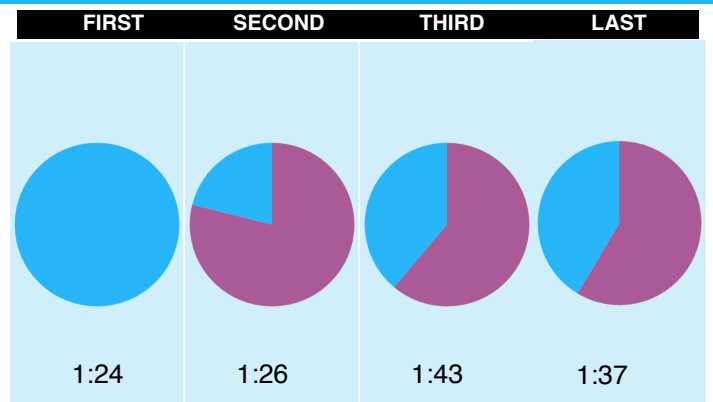

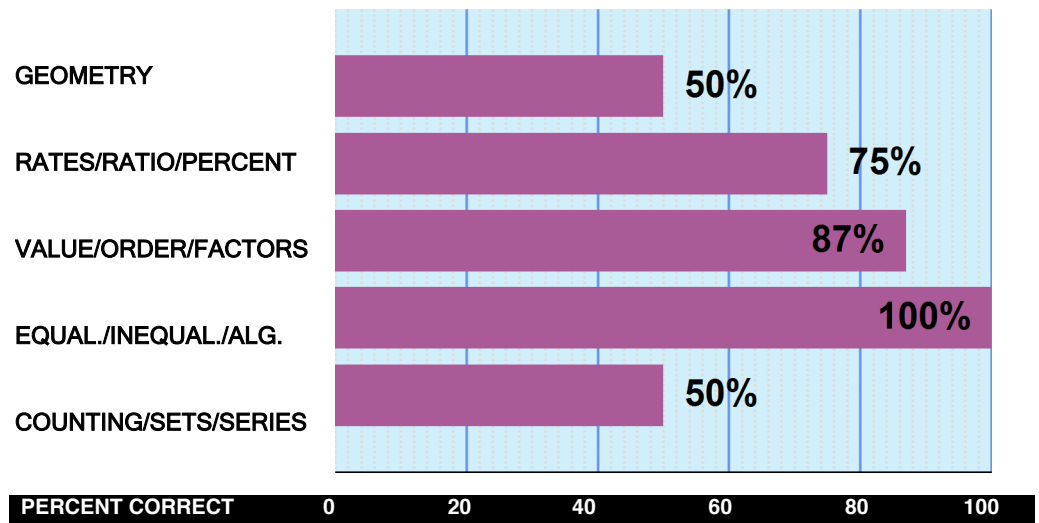

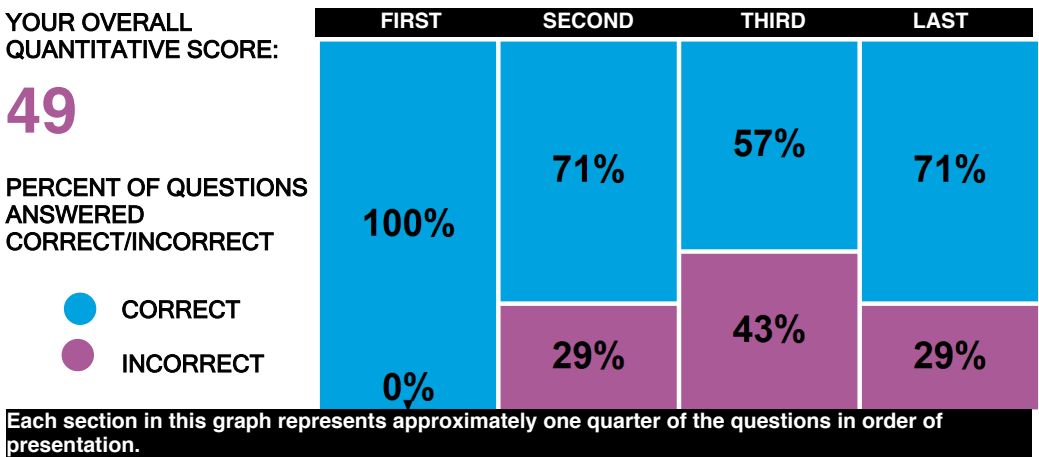

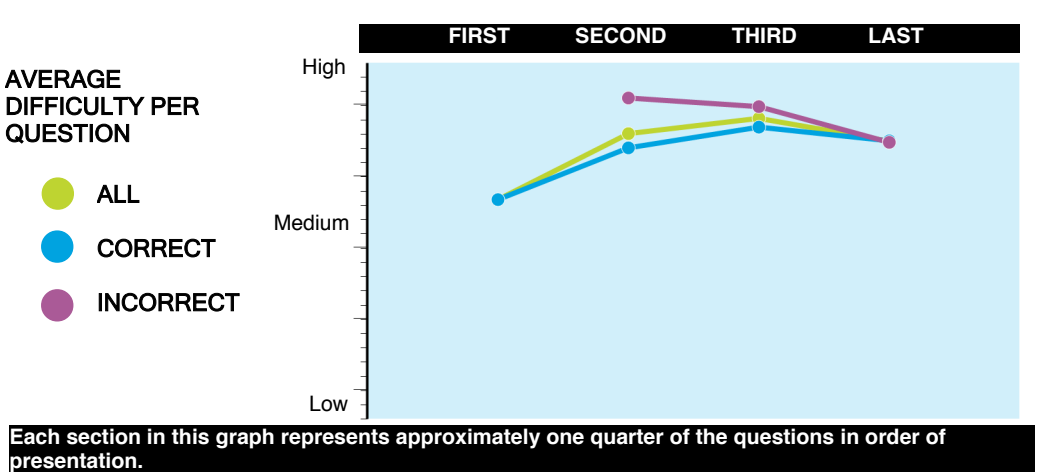
## PERFORMANCE BY FUNDAMENTAL SKILLS

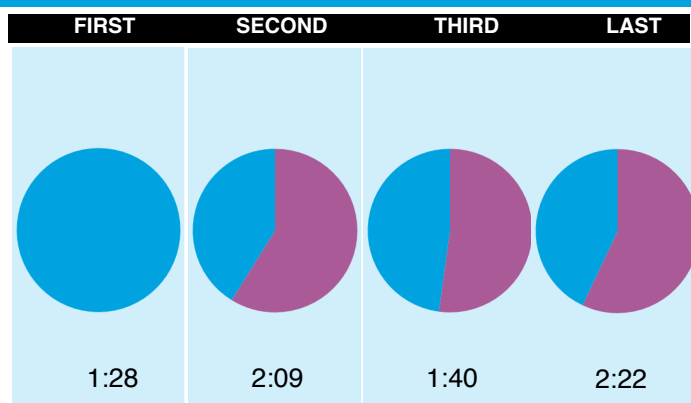
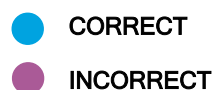

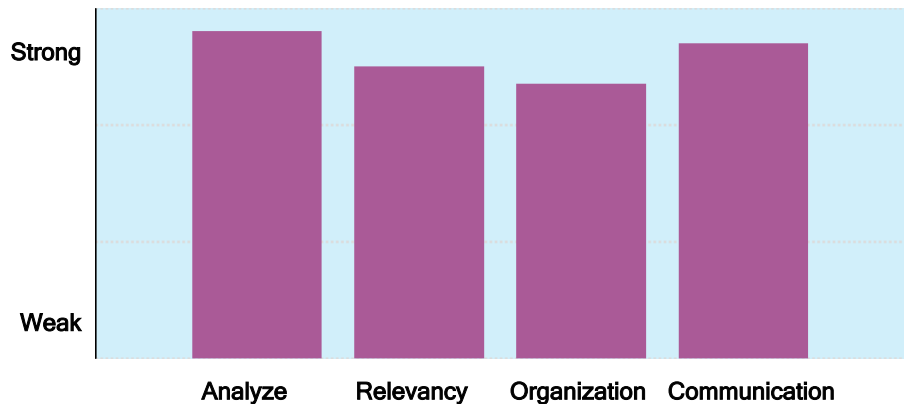
