

This sentence is correct, since LHS and RHS of *and* are *grammatically similar* (*Relative clauses / Dependent clauses*): *that he had inherited from his grandfather and that was truly vintage*.

Note#1: The word *while* is *not* an indicator of parallelism. So, the parts of the sentence connected by *while* do *not* need to be *grammatically similar*. For example, following is a correct sentence:

Peter met with an accident, while driving.

In this sentence, *met* is a *verb*, while *driving* is a *participle* and hence, they are *not* grammatically similar. However, this does *not* make this sentence incorrect, because, as noted above, parts of the sentence connected by *while* do *not* need to be grammatically similar (since *while* is *not* an indicator of parallelism).
