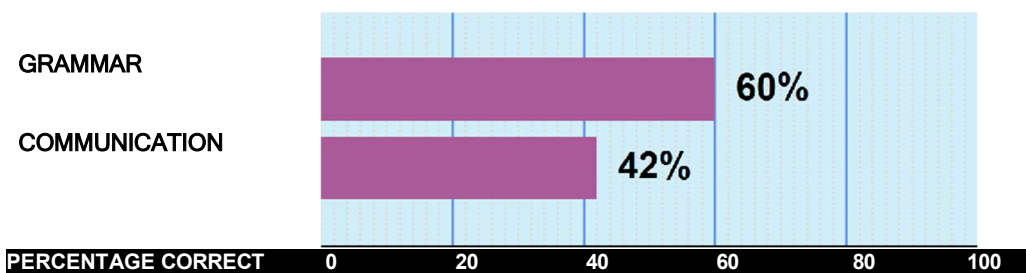

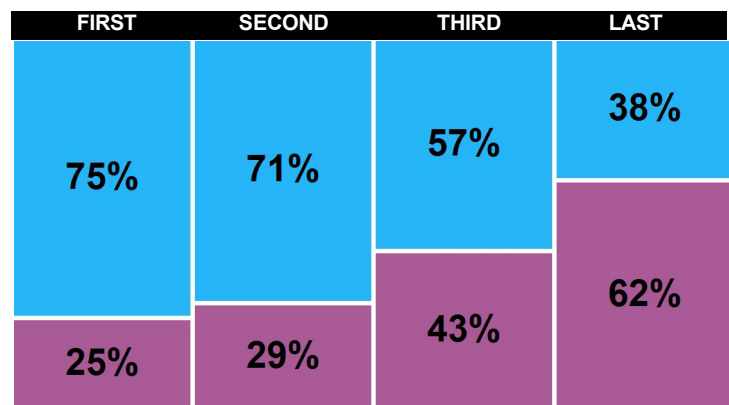

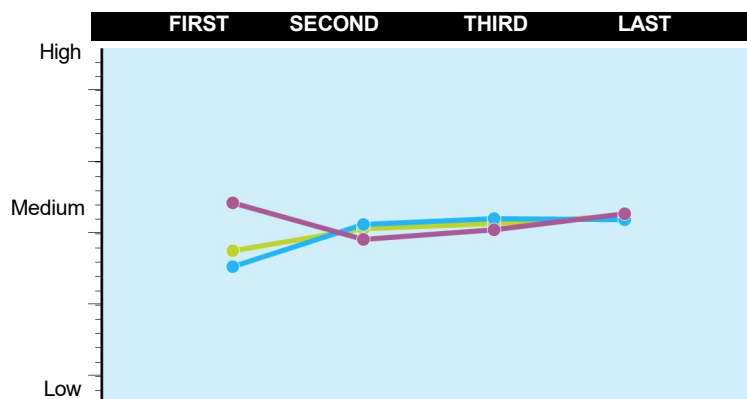

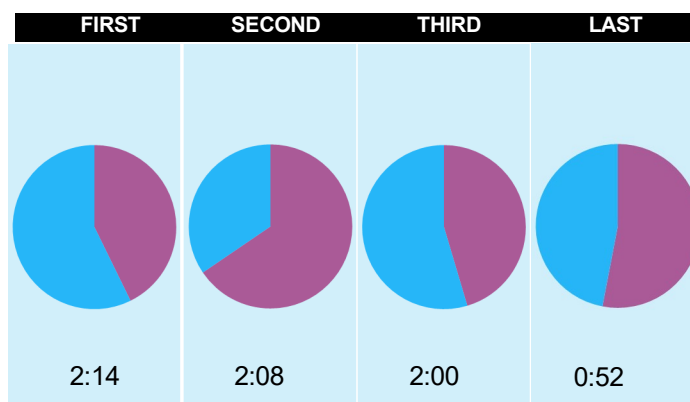

SUMMARY

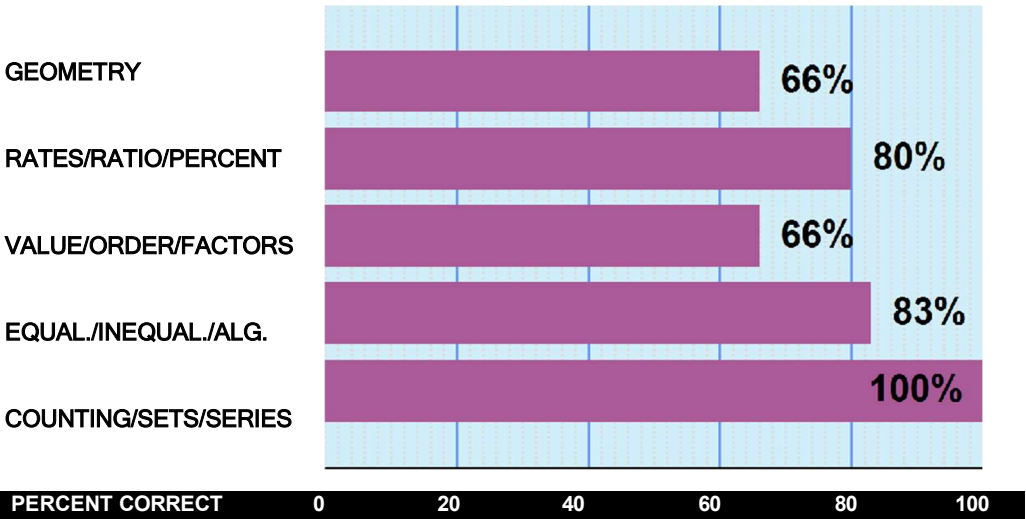

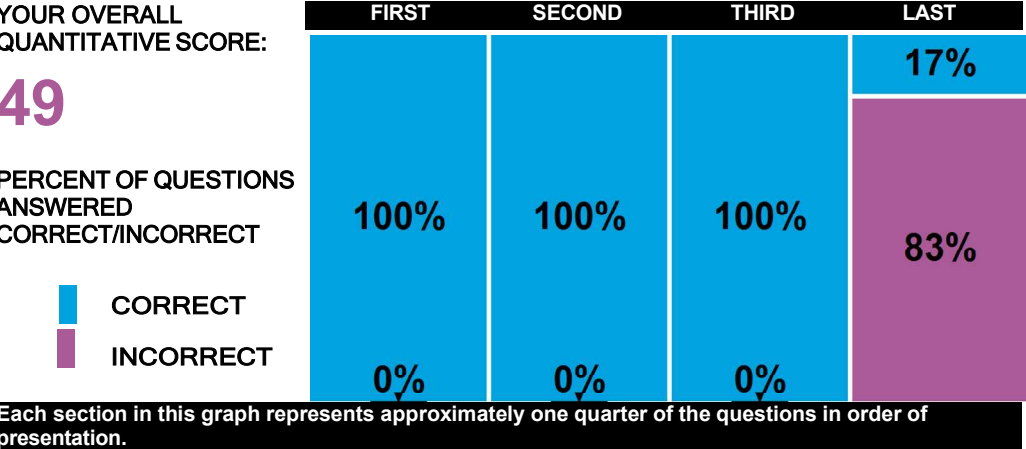

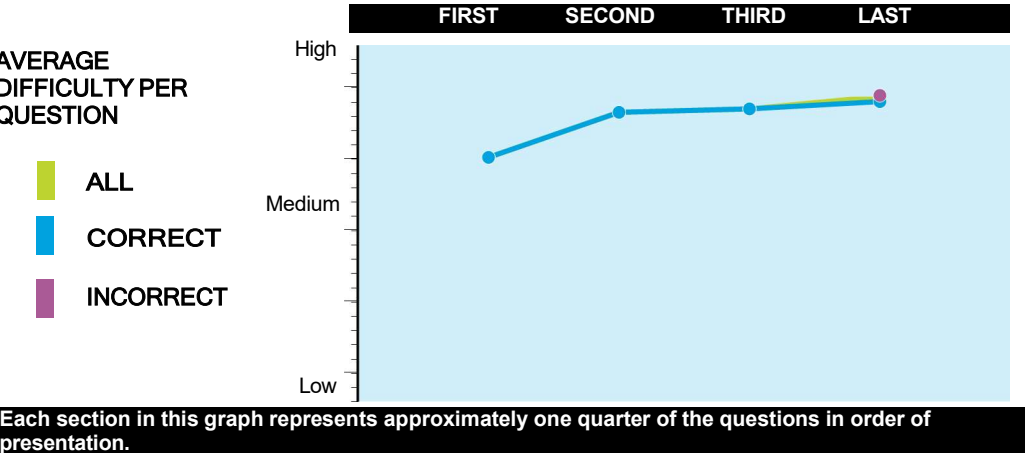
PERFORMANCE BY FUNDAMENTAL SKILLS



PERCENT CORRECT



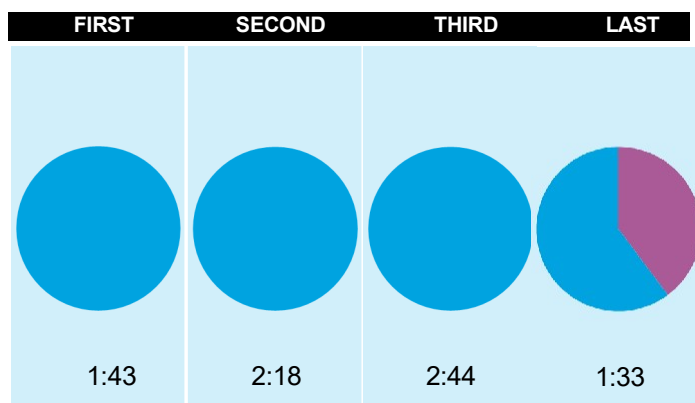
AVERAGE DIFFICULTY

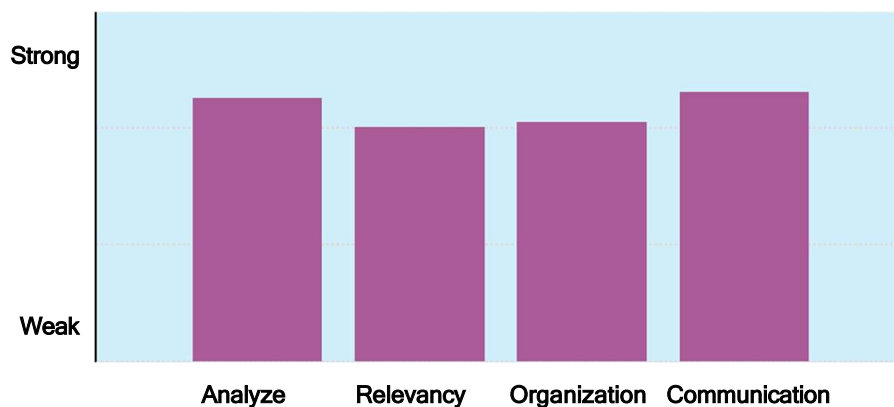
