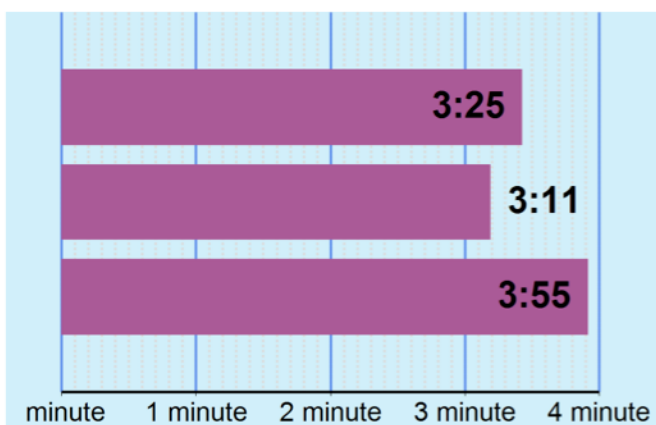

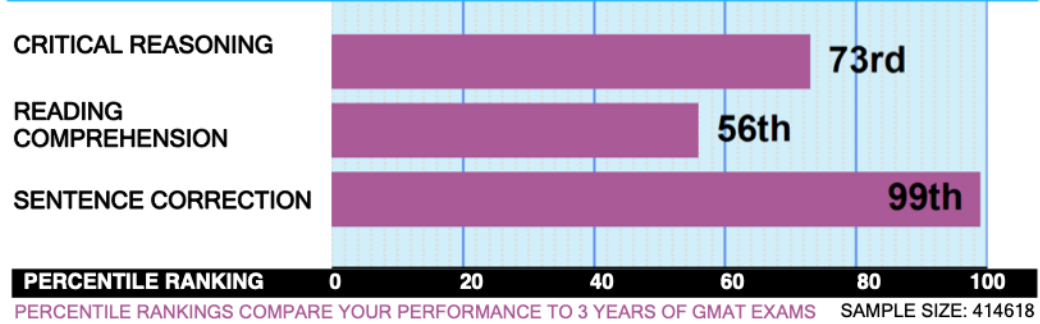
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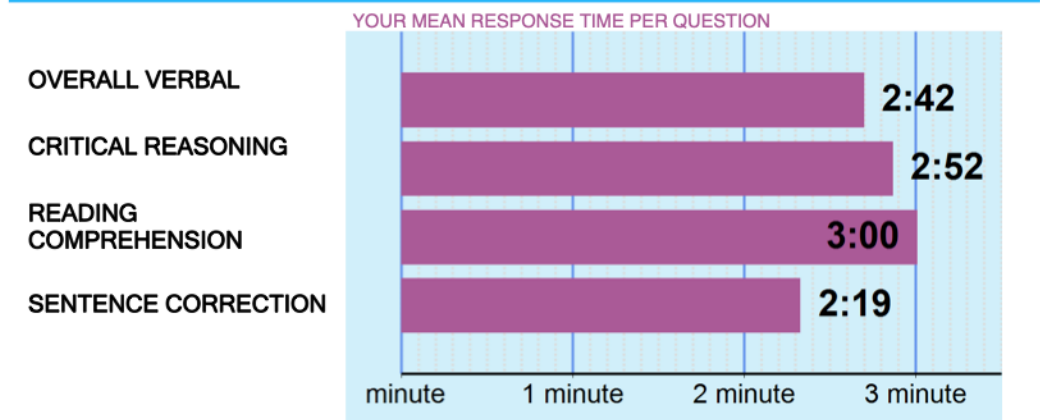
Verbal Section Performance

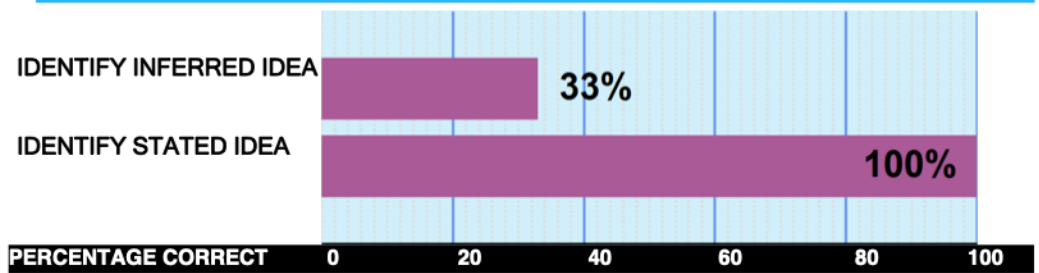

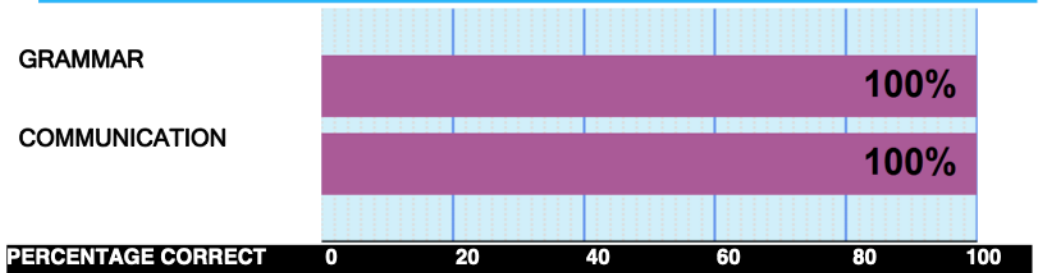

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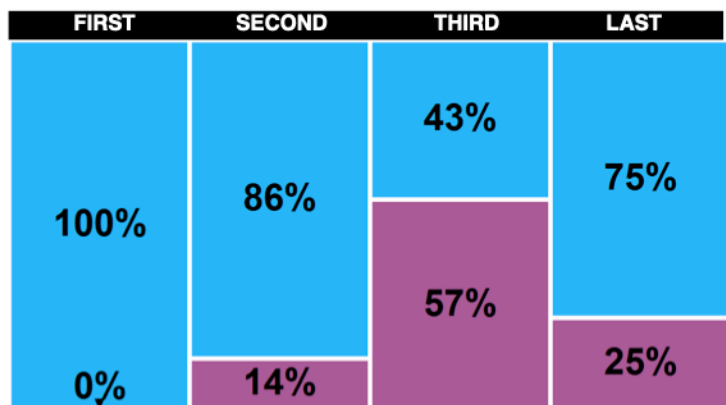

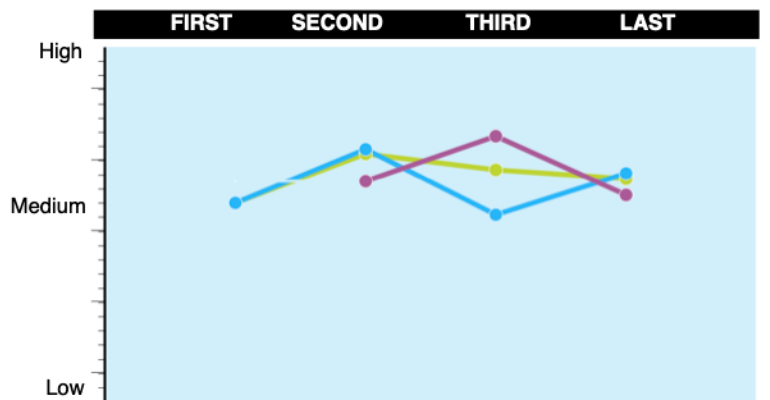

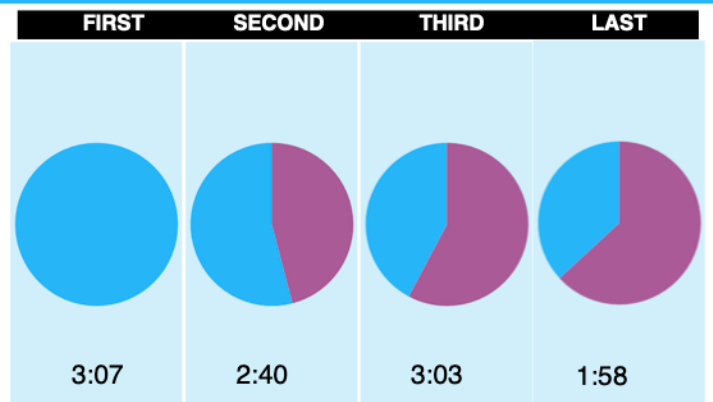

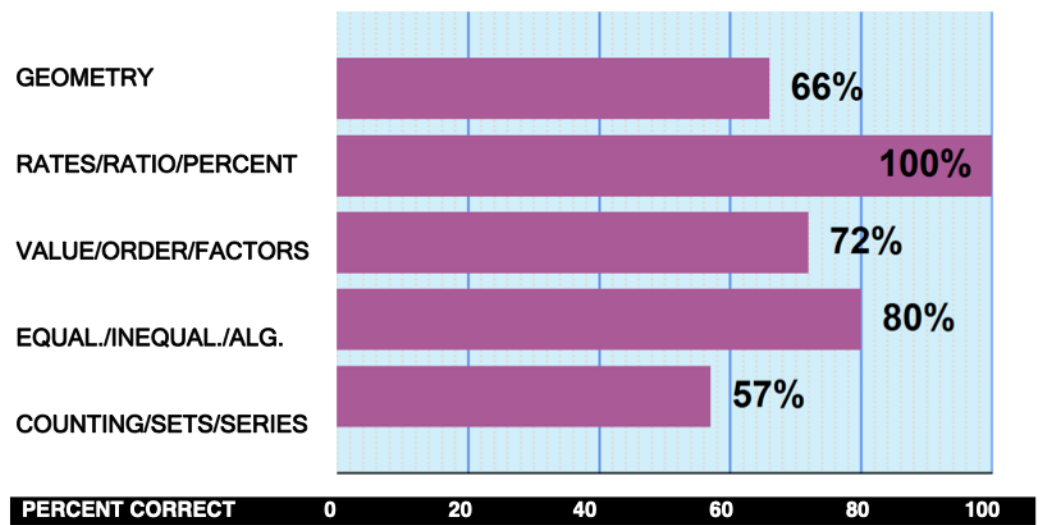

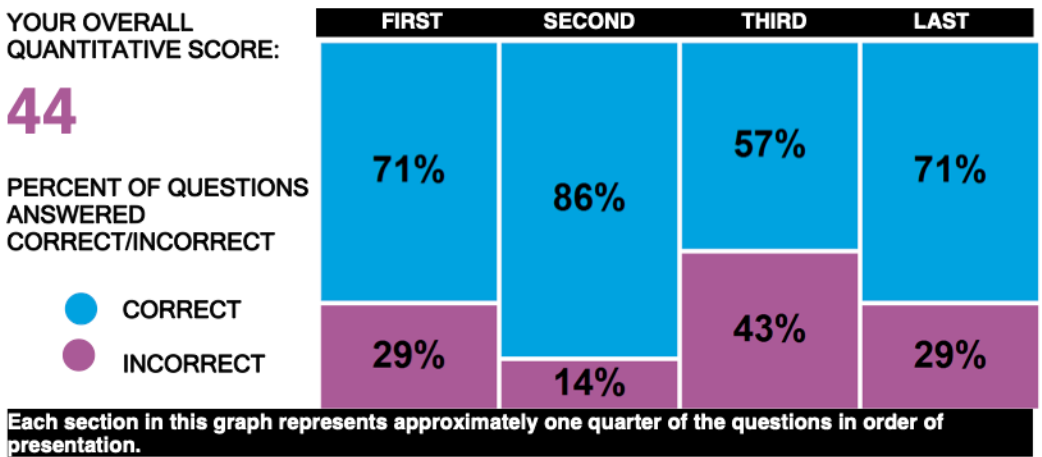
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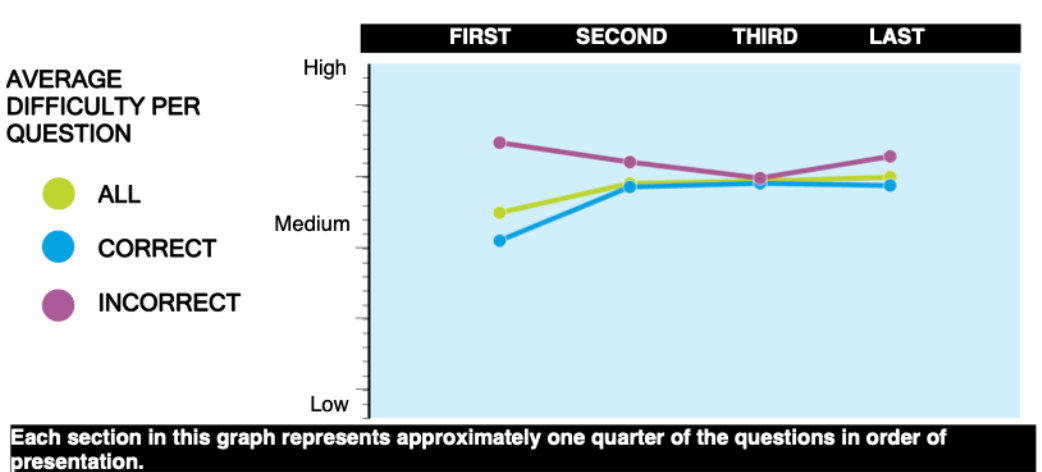
PERFORMANCE BY FUNDAMENTAL SKILLS

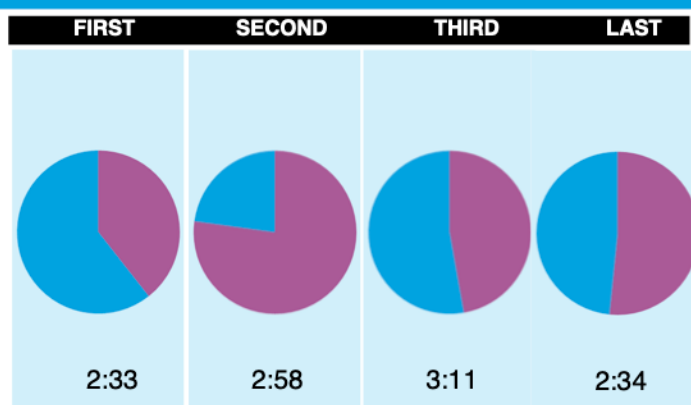
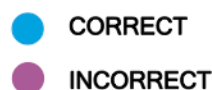
