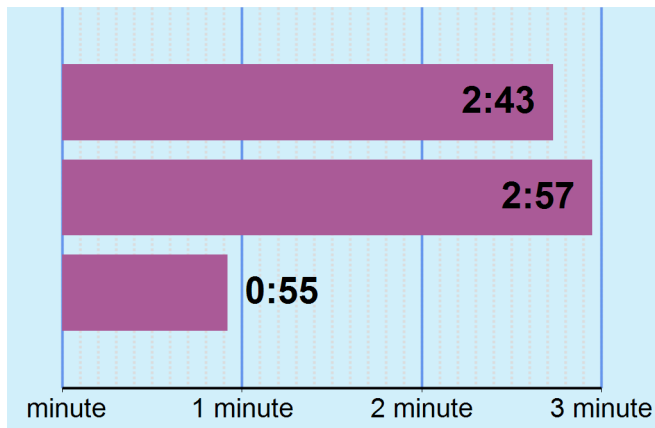

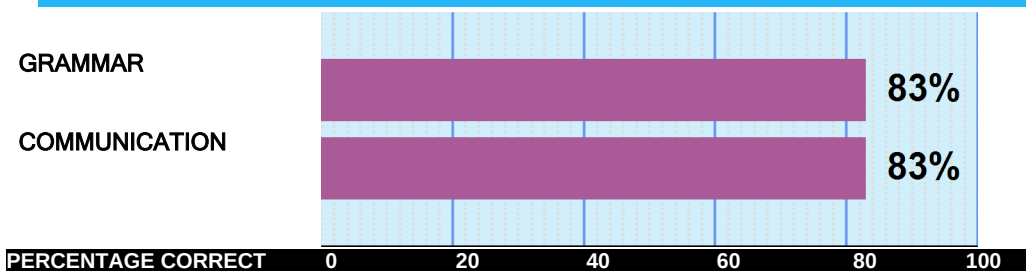

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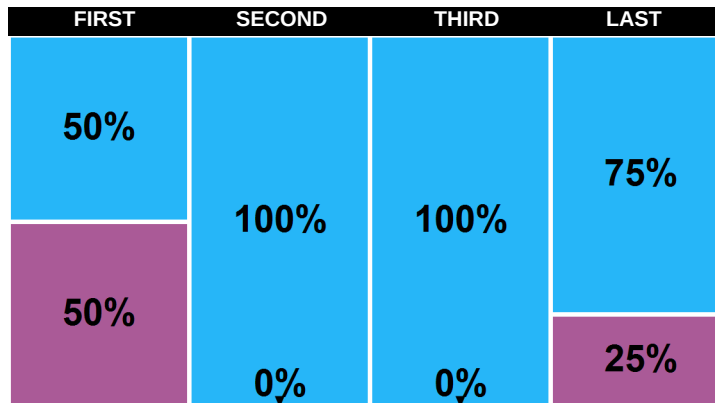

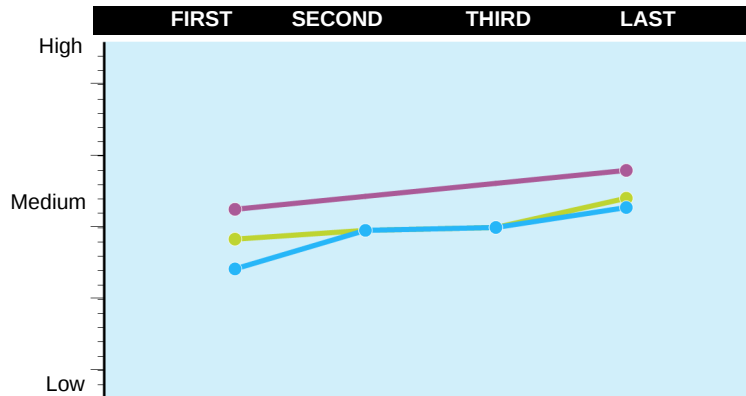

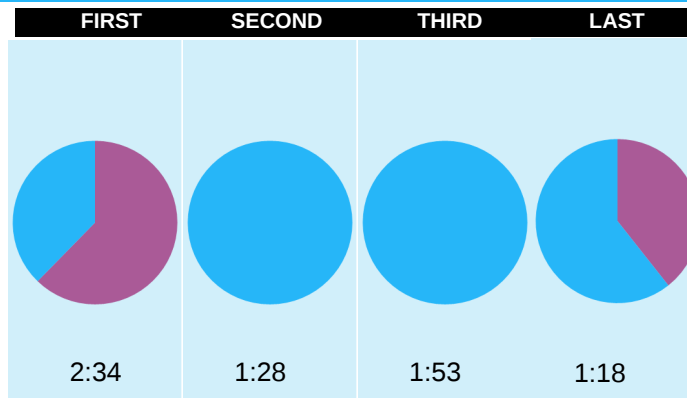

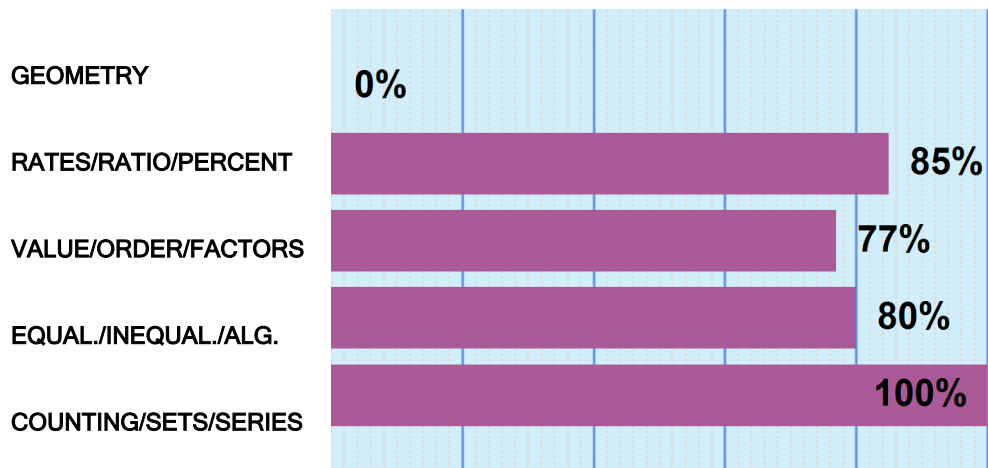

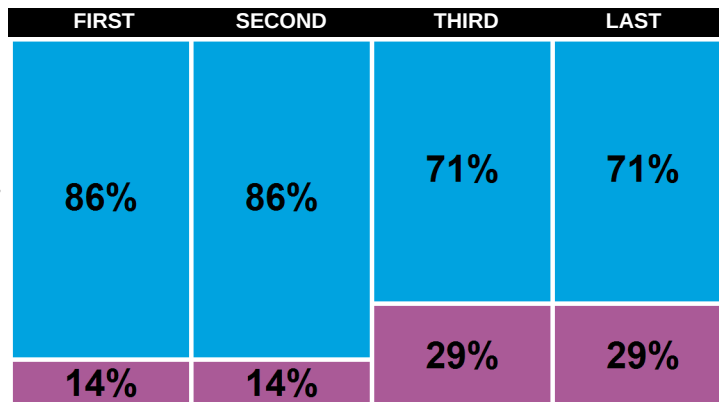

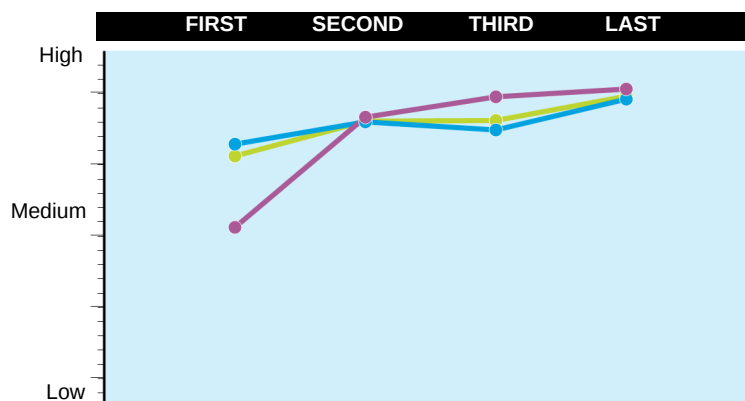

Each section in this graph represents approximately one quarter of the questions in order of presentation.

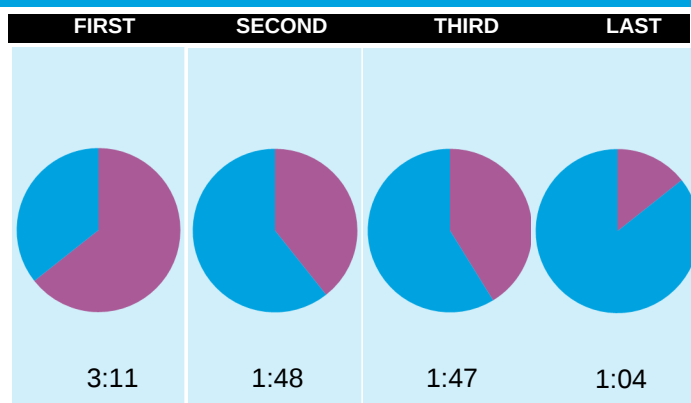
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TIME MANAGEMENT

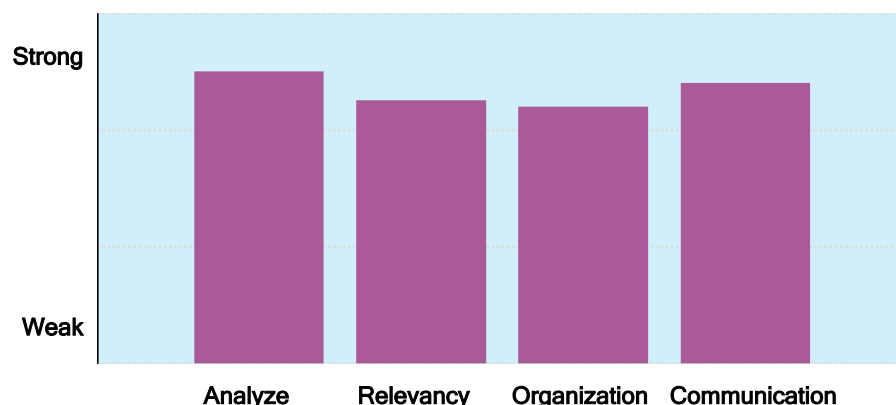
