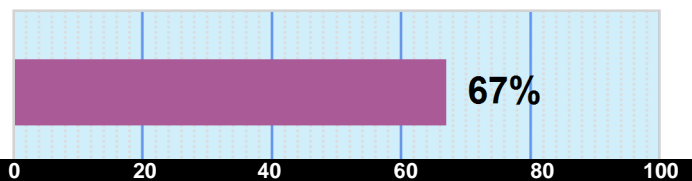

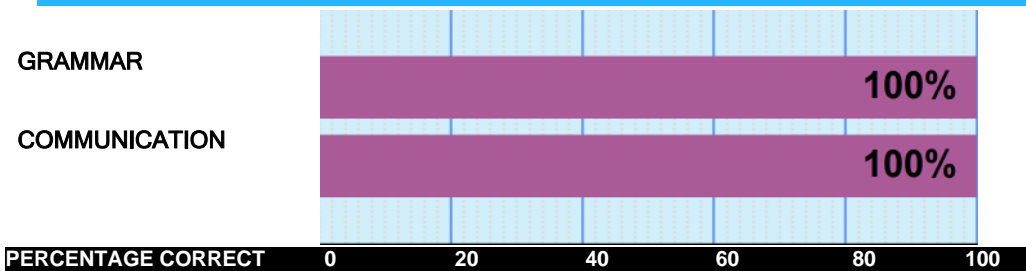

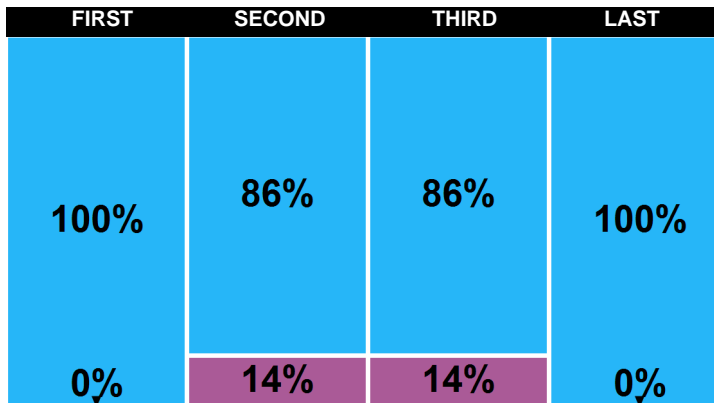

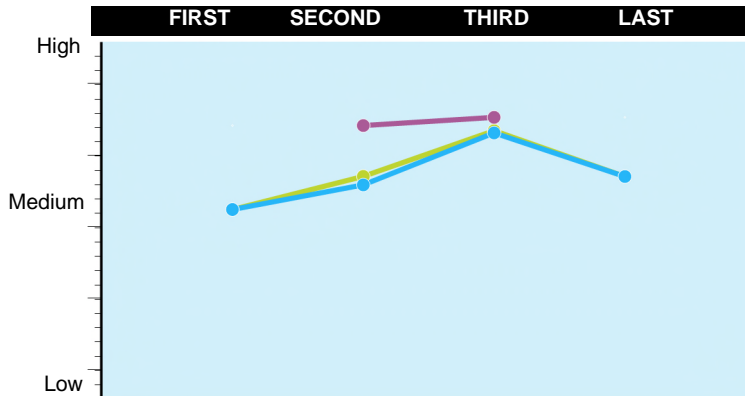

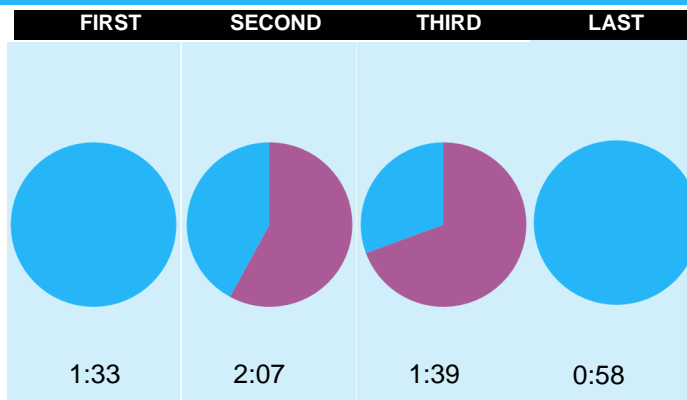

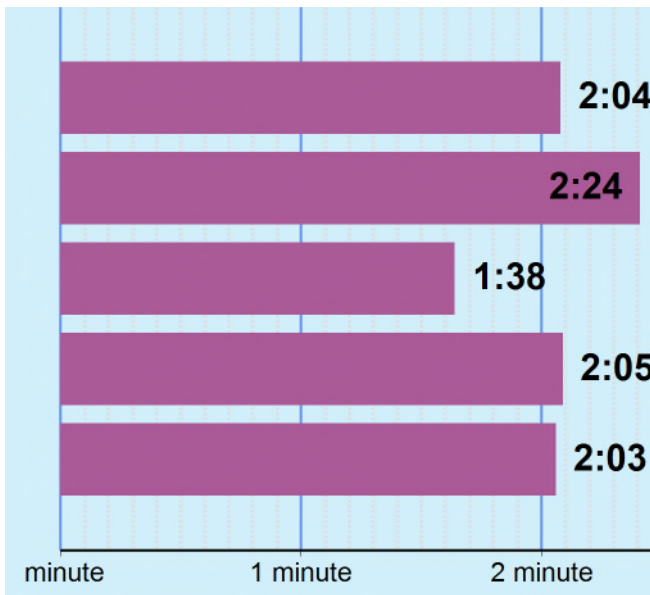

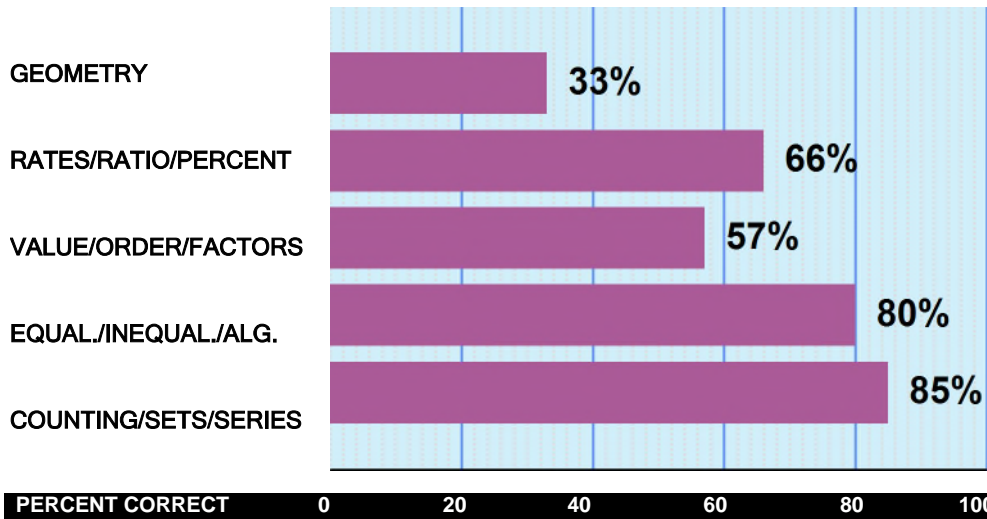

PERFORMANCE BY FUNDAMENTAL SKILLS



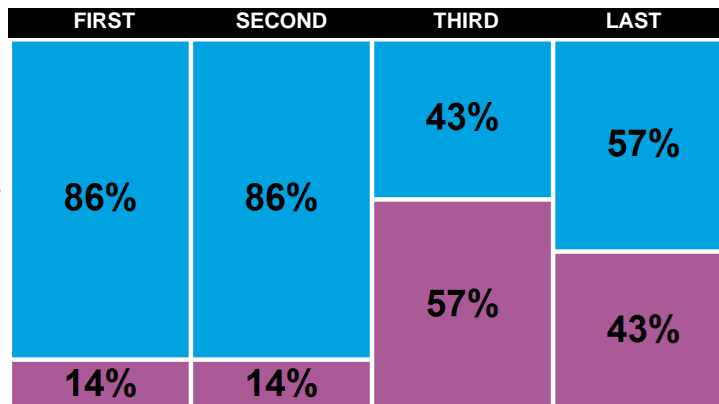

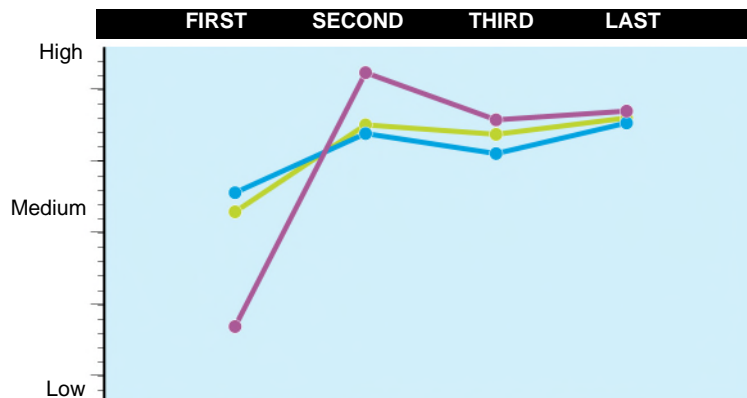
