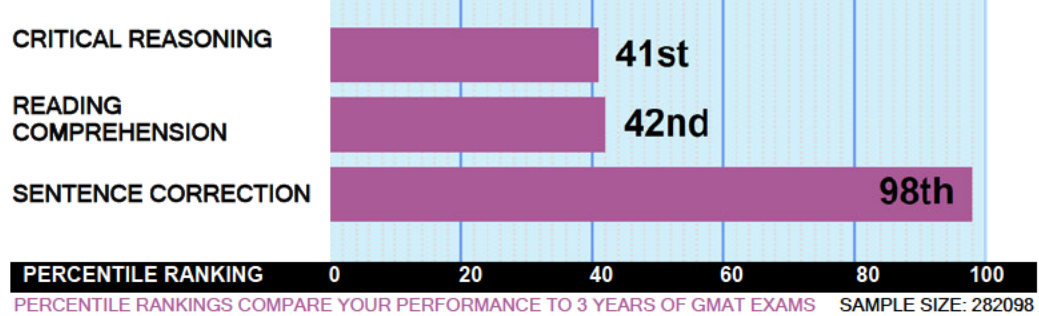
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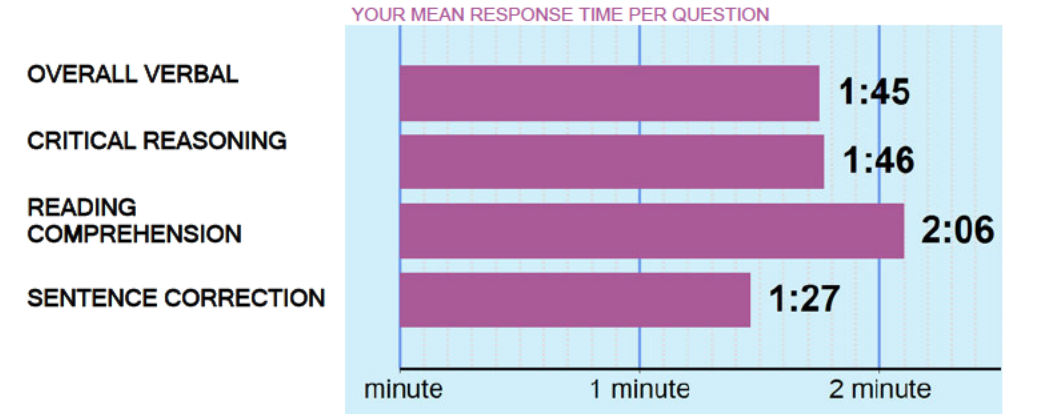
Verbal Section Performance

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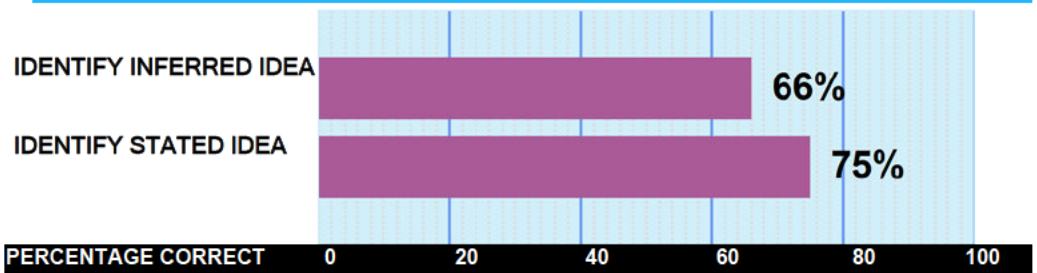

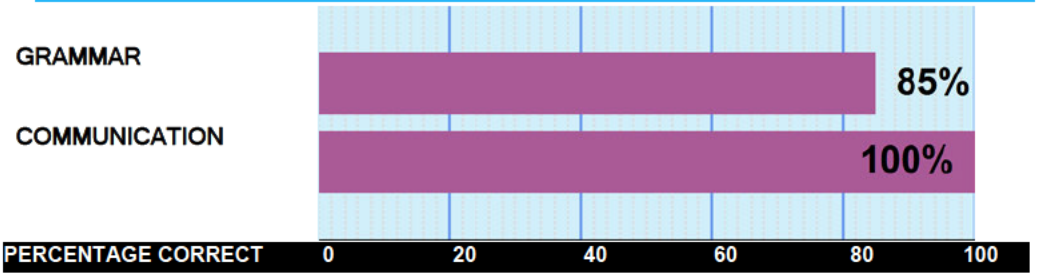

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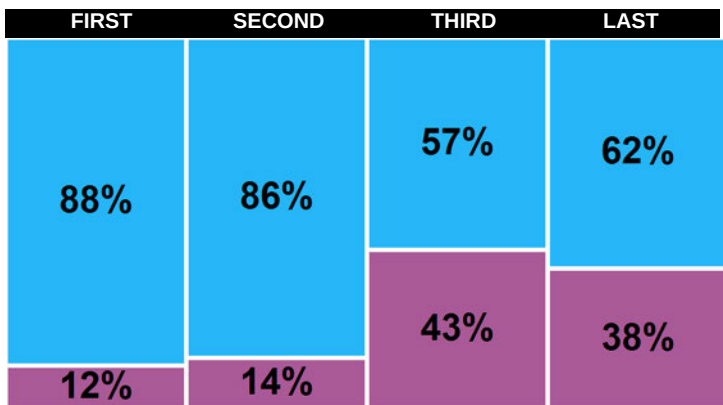

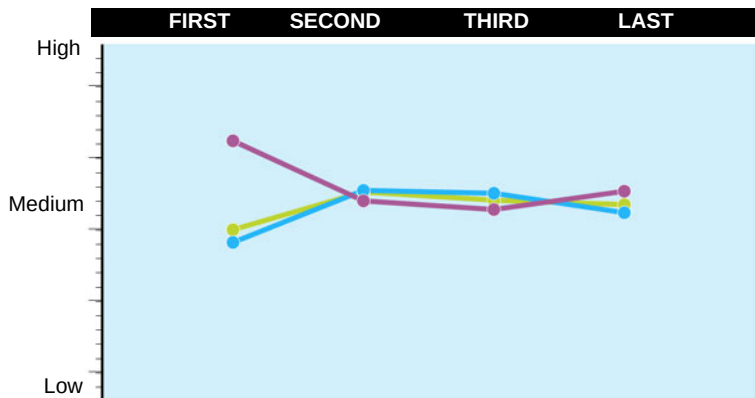

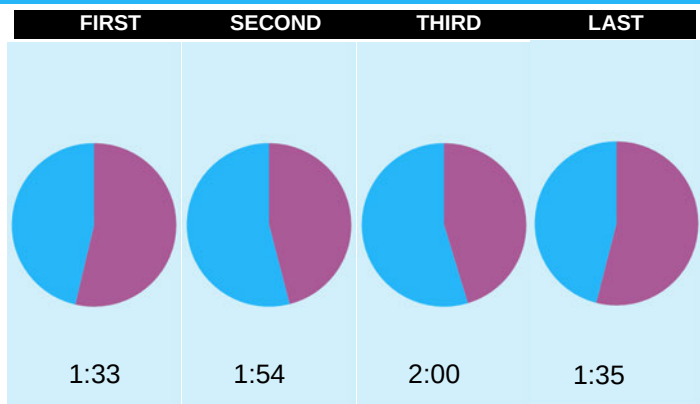

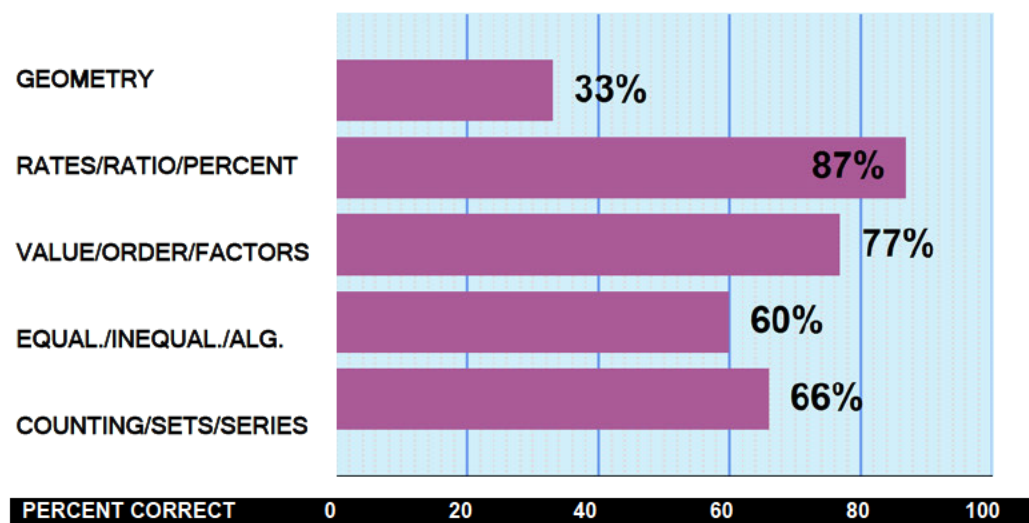

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PERFORMANCE BY FUNDAMENTAL SKILLS



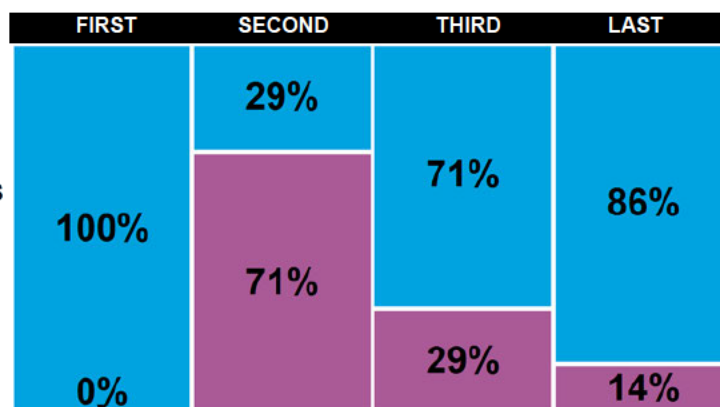

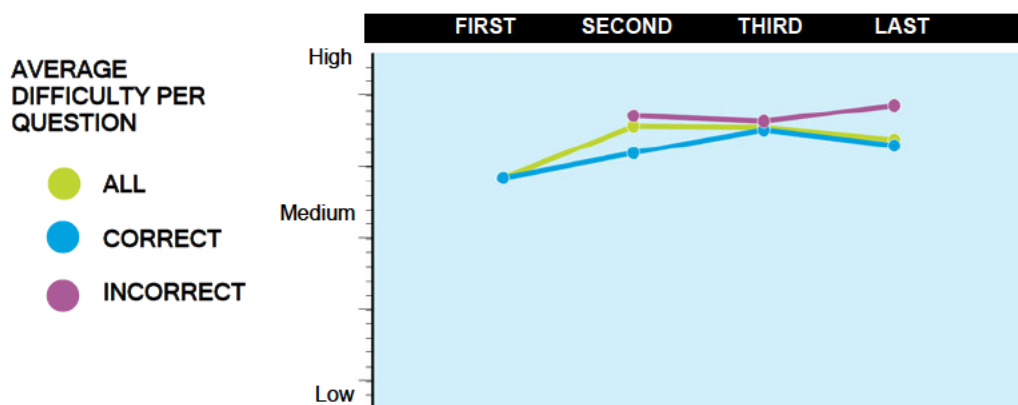

AVERAGE DIFFICULTY

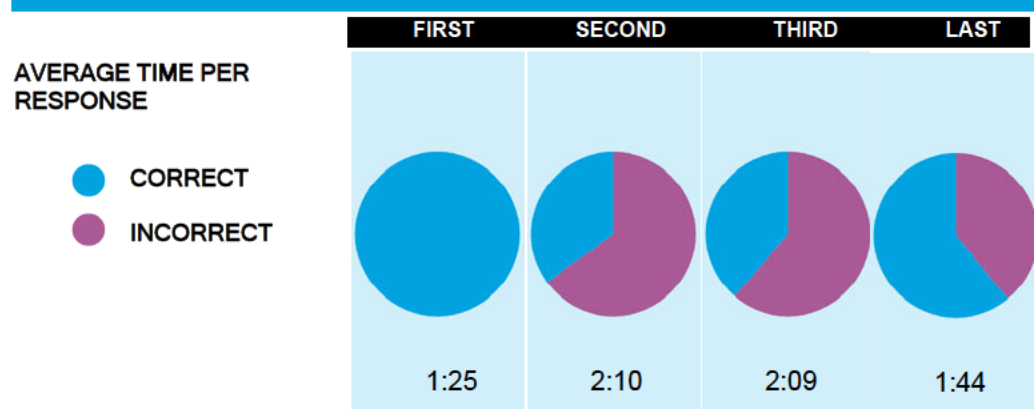


Each section in this graph represents approximately one quarter of the questions in order of presentation.

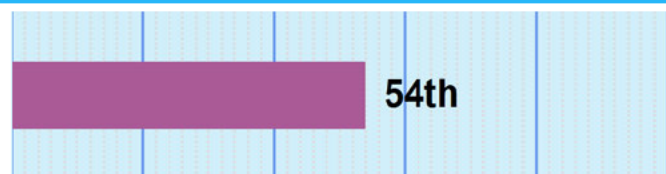
