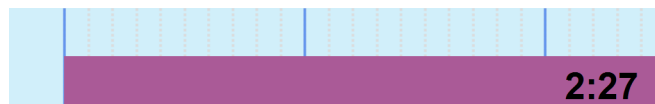

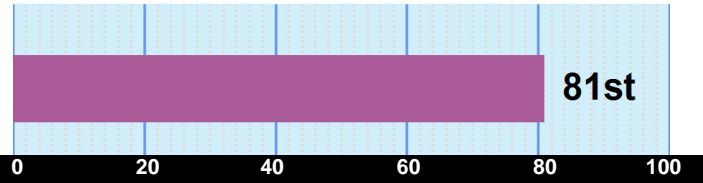

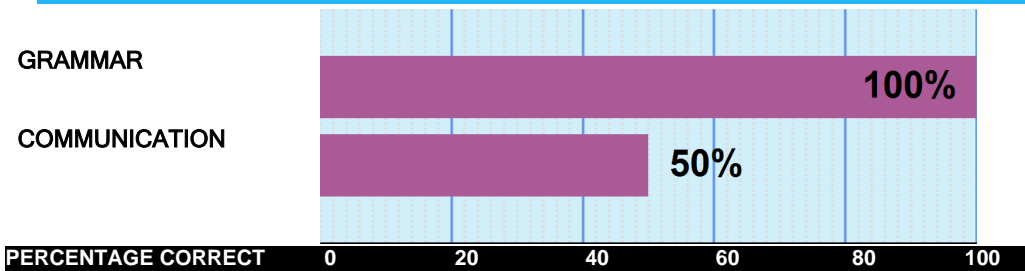

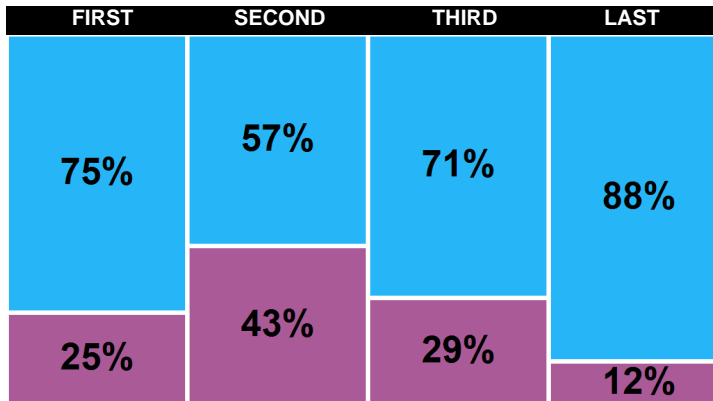

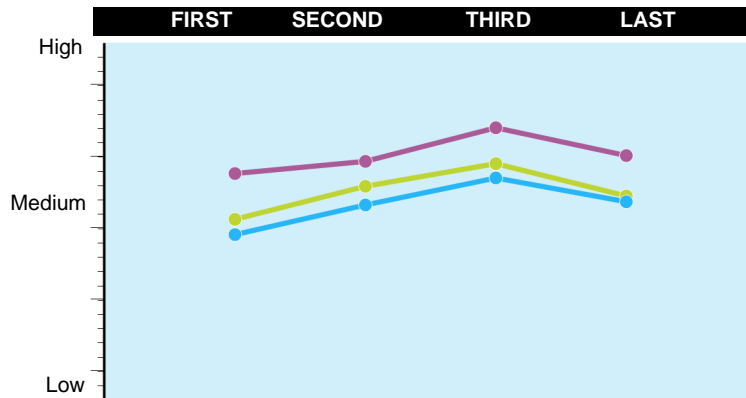

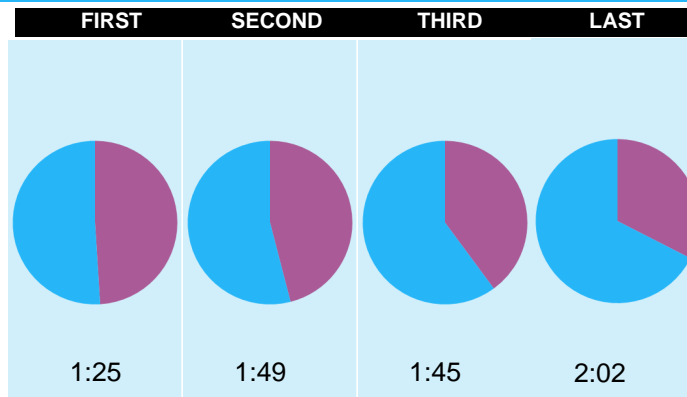

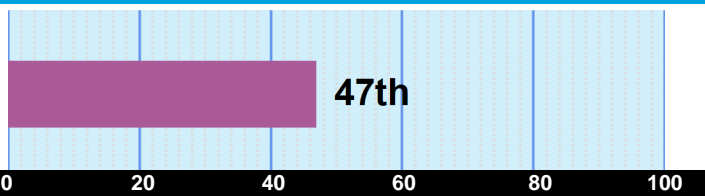
## SUMMARY

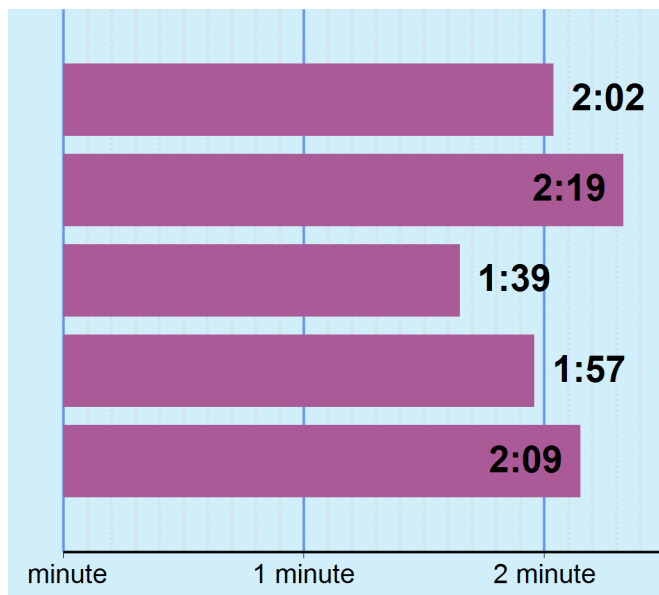

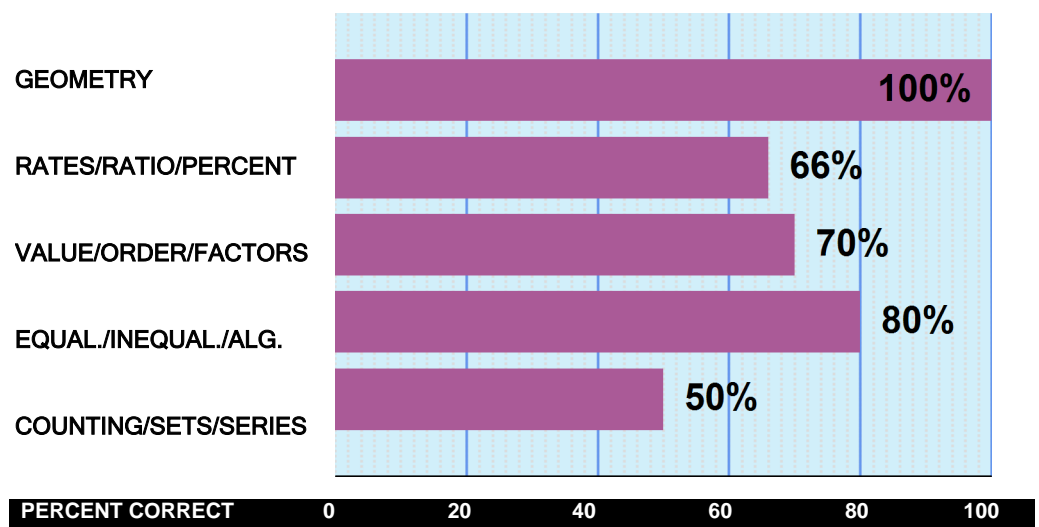

## PERFORMANCE BY FUNDAMENTAL SKILLS



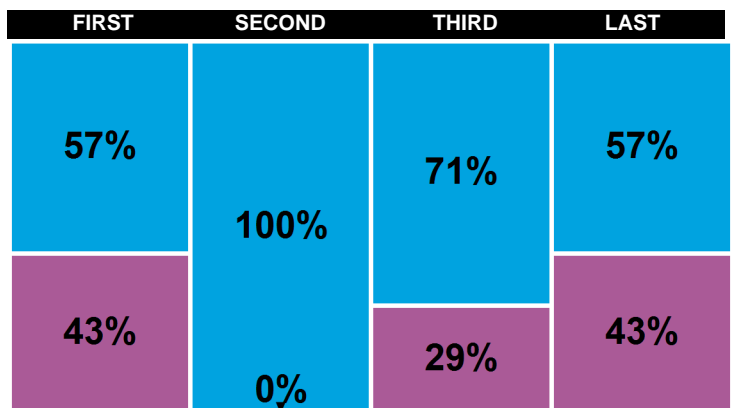

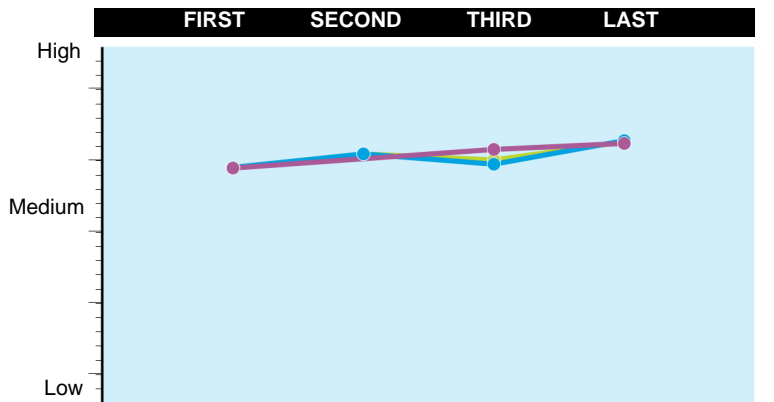

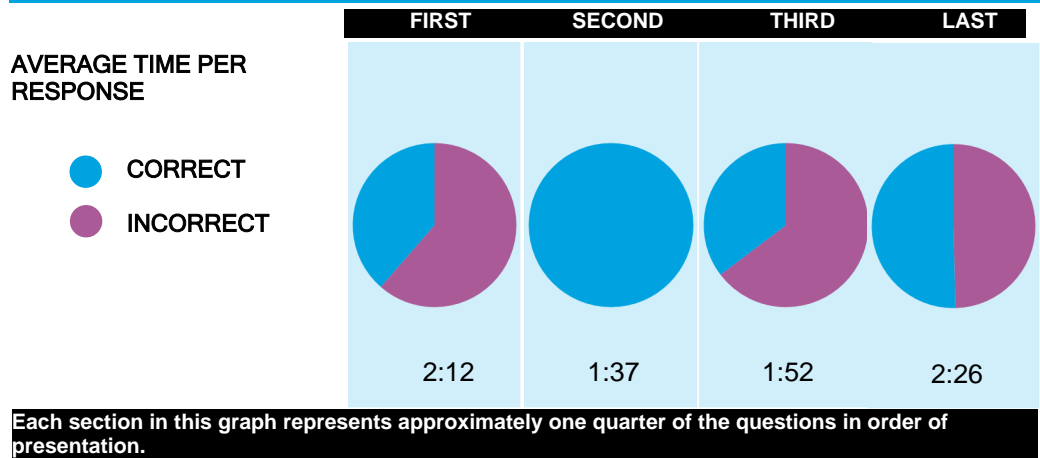
AVERAGE DIFFICULTY PER QUESTION
